CHAPTER 109.

AN ACT

[H. B. 43]

To accept the benefits of the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to establish agricultural experiment stations in connection with the colleges established in the several States under the provisions of an Act approved July 2, 1862, and of the Acts supplementary thereto", approved March 2, 1887, as amended and supplemented and known as the Hatch Act; and an Act entitled "An Act to provide for cooperative extension work between agricultural colleges in the United States receiving the benefits of an Act of Congress approved July 2, 1862, and of Acts supplementary thereto, and the United States Department of Agriculture" approved May 8, 1914, as amended and supplemented, and known as the Smith-Lever Act, as the same are extended to the Territory of Alaska by an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to extend the benefits of the Hatch Act and the Smith-Lever Act to the Territory of Alaska", approved February 23, 1929, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The grants of moneys authorized by Act of Congress entitled "An Act to establish agricultural experiment stations in connection with the colleges established in the several States under the provisions of an Act approved July 2, 1862, and of the Acts sup- Benefits of Congressional Acts providing for agricultural experiment stations accepted.

In accordance with the provisions of the Hatch Act as extended to the Territory of Alaska the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines is hereby designated as the beneficiary under the provisions of said Act and is hereby empowered to establish a department to be known and designated as an agricultural experiment station.

Benefits of Congressional Acts providing for cooperative extension work accepted.

Section 3. That the sums of money appropriated for extension work under an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide for cooperate [cooperative] extension work between agricultural colleges in the United States receiving the benefits of an Act of Congress approved July 2, 1862, and of Acts supplementary thereto, and the United States Department of Agriculture" approved May 8, 1914, as amended and supplemented, and known as the Smith-Lever Act and extended to the Territory of Alaska by an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to extend the benefits of the Hatch Act the Smith-Lever Act to the Territory of Alaska", approved February 23, 1929, being made subject to the legislative assent of

the Territory of Alaska to the purpose of said appropriations, the assent of the Territory of Alaska is hereby given to the purpose of said appropriations, and the conditions of the above specified Acts of Congress are hereby accepted by the Territory of Alaska, and the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska is hereby designated as the officer to whom said appropriations shall be paid.

Section 4. In accordance with the provisions of the Smith-Lever Act as extended to the Territory of Alaska the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines is hereby designated as the beneficiary under the provisions of said Act, and is hereby empowered to administer and carry on agricultural extension work in the Territory of Alaska in cooperation with the United States Department of Agriculture.

CHAPTER 110.
