

CHAPTER 11.

AN ACT

[S. B. 20]

To repeal Chapter 15 of the 1913 Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska relative to procedure when property levied on by virtue of writ of execution, attachment, or other process, is claimed by third persons.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Chapter 15 of the 1913 Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska be and the same is hereby repealed. Repeal.

CHAPTER 12.

AN ACT

[S. B. 21]

Defining the authority of the United States Marshal when property levied upon or taken by him by virtue of a writ of execution, attachment, or other process is claimed by any other person than the defendant.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. If any property levied upon or taken by the marshal by virtue of a writ of execution, attachment, or other process, is claimed by any other person than the defendant, and such person, his agent or attorney, makes affidavit of his title thereto, or right to the possession thereof and the ground of such title or right, stating the value thereof, the marshal shall release such levy or taking, unless the plaintiff, on demand, indemnify the marshal against such claim by bond executed by two sufficient sureties who shall justify in double the value of said property and otherwise as in case of attachment bonds; and notwithstanding such claim, when so made, the marshal may retain such property under levy a reasonable time to demand such indemnity. If in such case, the person claiming the Marshal's authority over property levied on and claimed by third party.
