Section 5. No part of the moneys hereby appropriated, or of any other Territorial moneys, may be used for the purchase, rental or acquisition of the grounds on which any school house constructed hereunder shall be built, or for the yards or grounds adjacent thereto, and all such grounds must be furnished without cost to the Territory. Provided, however, that if a building is purchased hereunder, the ground on which it is situated and the reasonably necessary surrounding yards and grounds may be purchased with such building.

Proviso.

Section 6. That the sum hereby appropriated shall not be in addition to any money otherwise appropriated by the Territory for the construction of school buildings, and shall cover the entire cost of such construction and erection, or of the purchase, repair, improvement and alteration, as the case may be, of a public school house at Tanana, Alaska.

Emergency.

Section 7. This Act shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 36.

AN ACT

[S. B. 38]

To amend Section 903 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, relative to the verification of pleadings.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 903 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska be, and the same hereby is, amended so as to read as follows:

Verification
of pleadings
by party.

Sec. 903. Every pleading shall be subscribed by the party or his attorney, and, except

a demurrer, shall also be verified by the party, his agent or attorney, to the effect that he believes it to be true. The verification must be made by the affidavit of the party, or, if there be several parties united in interest and pleading together, by one, at least, of such parties, if such party or parties be present at the place where the affidavit of verification is made; otherwise the affidavit may be made by the agent or attorney of the party. The affidavit may also be made by the agent or attorney if the action or defense be founded on a written instrument for the payment of money only, and such instrument be in the possession of the agent or attorney, or if all the material allegations of the pleading be within the personal knowledge of the agent or attorney. When a corporation is a party, the verification may be made by any officer or agent thereof upon whom service of a summons might be made, or, if no such officer or agent is present at the place where the affidavit of verification is made, by the attorney of the party; and when the United States, or any officer thereof in its behalf, is a party, the verification may be made by any person to whom all the material allegations of the pleading are known. When the affidavit is made by the agent or attorney, it must set forth the reason of his making it, except as to the affidavit of an agent of a corporation. When the affidavit is made by the attorney, the court may, for good cause shown and where the ends of justice will be plainly thereby subserved, and upon reasonable cause therefor given, require another affidavit to be made

CHAPTER 37.

AN ACT

[S. B. 40]

Denouncing as criminal and providing for punishment for the arrest, detention or attachment of the dead body of any human being.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Penalty for
detaining
dead body for
debt.

Section 1. Every person who arrests or attaches, or wilfully attempts to arrest or attach, any dead body of a human being, or who detains or claims to detain it for any debt or demand or upon any pretended lien or charge, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars or by imprisonment for the term of not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

CHAPTER 38.

AN ACT

[S. B. 44]

To amend Section 2 and Section 3, of Chapter 8, of the Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska for the year 1917, relative to the practice of medicine and surgery in the Territory of Alaska and to the creation and duties of a Medical Examining Board.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 2 of Chapter 8 of the 1917 Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska is hereby amended so as to read as follows:
