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## CHAPTER 37.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 40]

Denouncing as criminal and providing for punishment for the arrest, detention or attachment of the dead body of any human being.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Every person who arrests or attaches, or wilfully attempts to arrest or attach, any dead body of a human being, or who detains or claims to detain it for any debt or demand or upon any pretended lien or charge, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars or by imprisonment for the term of not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

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## CHAPTER 38.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 44]

To amend Section 2 and Section 3, of Chapter 8, of the Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska for the year 1917, relative to the practice of medicine and surgery in the Territory of Alaska and to the creation and duties of a Medical Examining Board.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 2 of Chapter 8 of the 1917 Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 2. The Governor of Alaska shall appoint a Board of Examiners, to be known as the Territorial Medical Board, consisting of

Five (5) members, two from the First Division and one from each of the other three Divisions, who shall be learned and skilled in the theory and practice of medicine and surgery and shall be legal practitioners of medicine and surgery in Alaska. Said members shall be appointed for a term of four years and shall hold their office until their successors are appointed and qualified. In the event that a member is unavoidably prevented from attending a regular meeting of the Board of Examiners, the Governor is authorized to appoint a properly qualified physician as substitute examiner to serve pro tem and with the same duties and responsibilities as the regular member, so unavoidably absent.

Section 2. That Section 3, of Chapter 8 of the Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska of the year 1917, be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 3. The members of said Board shall before entering upon their duties as such members, take and subscribe an oath to support the Constitution and the Laws of the United States and the Territory of Alaska, and to well and faithfully and without partiality perform the duties of such office according to the best of their knowledge and ability; which oaths shall be filed and preserved for record in the office of the Secretary of said Board. Said Medical Board shall elect a President and Secretary-Treasurer, from their membership and shall have a common seal. The President and Secretary-Treasurer, shall have the power to administer oaths. The said Medical Board shall hold their regular meetings for examination commencing on the first Tuesday of March and September of each year. Said meetings

shall be held at Juneau, Alaska, or at such other place as the Board shall designate. The Board is hereby authorized to hold special meetings for the examination of applicants if and when the same becomes expedient. Two members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business that may properly come before the Board except the issuance and revocation of licenses.

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## CHAPTER 39.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 46]

To regulate the practice of dentistry in the Territory of Alaska and to provide for the examination, regulation, licensing and registration of persons engaged in the practice of dentistry and for the punishment of offenders against this Act, and repealing Chapter 84 Session Laws of Alaska 1913, relating to the same subject.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

File certificate.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to practice dentistry in the Territory of Alaska unless he has been duly registered by the Board of Dental Examiners established by this Act, has received and filed his certificate of such registration, and is in all respects in good standing as a dentist, pursuant to the provisions of this Act.

Dental Board established.

Section 2. A Board of Dental Examiners for the Territory is hereby created. Such Board shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by the Governor for a term of five years, except that vacancies shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired term. Members shall serve until their successors are duly appointed. No one shall be qualified to serve as member of the Board unless he is a resident of the Territory
