

## CHAPTER 57.

## AN ACT

[S. B. 70]

To amend Section 1114 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska relative to revival of judgments.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 1114 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska be and the same hereby is amended by adding a new subdivision to said Section, at the end of said Section, the same to be the Seventh subdivision of said Section, and to read as follows:

“Seventh. The party in whose favor a judgment is given may at the time of filing with the Clerk motion for leave to issue execution as in this Section provided or at any time thereafter before final order is made in the proceeding had thereon, cause the property of the judgment debtor to be attached and held during the time said motion is pending and until final order is made thereon; Such attachment shall be made in the same manner and under the same conditions as property is attached in any action before judgment, and for the purpose of such attachment the said judgment shall be deemed an implied contract for the direct payment of money within the meaning of the provisions of Section 968 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska. In the event that upon the hearing had on any motion filed under the provisions of this Section for leave to issue execution the court shall grant the motion and direct that execution be issued, the court shall further order that any property of the judgment debtor theretofore attached hereunder shall be sold for the satis-

faction of such execution and the Marshal shall apply the property attached by him or the proceeds thereof upon the execution."

## CHAPTER 58.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 74]

To require dealers in second hand articles to keep records of transactions and providing a penalty.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Second-hand dealers to keep permanent record of purchases.

Section 1. Any person engaged in the business of buying and selling second hand articles shall keep a true and correct record in writing and in permanent form showing each article purchased, the time of purchase, the price paid and the name of the person from whom purchased. Such record shall be made immediately after the purchase is made and shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any Marshal or Deputy Marshal.

Contents of records and when made.

Inspection by Marshal.

Penalty.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of Section 1 of this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment for not to exceed thirty days.
