

## CHAPTER 67.

## AN ACT

[H. B. 47]

To remunerate St. Joseph's Hospital of Fairbanks, Alaska, for hospitalization of Otto Wehner, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Appropriation to  
reimburse  
St. Joseph's  
Hospital.

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of funds in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of \$2,964.00 as balance on remuneration for St. Joseph's Hospital of Fairbanks, Alaska, for hospitalization of Otto Wehner from March 8th, 1920, to September 11th, 1926, and the Treasurer of the Territory is directed to pay the said sum to the said hospital.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 68.

## AN ACT

[H. B. 55]

To prescribe rules and regulations for the conduct of the Territorial offices and the payment of officers and employees thereof.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Territorial  
office hours  
and holidays  
fixed.

Section 1. All Territorial offices shall be open for business every day from 9 o'clock until 12 o'clock in the forenoon and from 1 o'clock until 5 o'clock in the afternoon except on Sundays and legal holidays, and except on Saturday afternoons between the first day of June and the 15th day of September.

Section 2. The head of any Territorial office may grant two weeks annual leave of absence with pay in any one year to each clerk or employee of such Territorial office, provided that such leave of absence may be made cumulative to the extent that instead of granting two weeks leave each year four weeks leave may be granted during each two years of service.

Power to grant leave—may be cumulative.

Where some member of the immediate family of a clerk or employee is afflicted with a contagious disease and requires the care and attendance of such employee, or where his or her presence in the office would jeopardize the health of fellow clerks, and in exceptional meritorious cases where a clerk or an employee is personally ill, and where to limit the annual leave to two weeks in any one calendar year would work peculiar hardship, it may be extended, in the discretion of the head of the office, with pay, not exceeding two weeks in any one case or in any one calendar year. This section shall not be construed to prevent the head of any executive office from granting two weeks annual leave with pay in any one year to a clerk or employee, notwithstanding such clerk or employee may have had during such year not exceeding two weeks leave with pay on account of sickness. Nor shall it be construed to mean that so long as a clerk or employee is borne upon the rolls of the office in excess of the time herein provided for or granted that he or she shall be entitled to pay during the period of such excessive absence, but that the pay shall stop upon the expiration of the granted leave.

Sick leave—extension of.

Sickness not bar to regular vacation.

Section 3. Where the compensation of any person in the service of the Territory is annual or monthly the following rules and division of time and computation of pay for services rendered are established:

Compensation, how computed.

Annual compensation shall be divided into twelve equal installments, one of which shall be the pay for each calendar month; and in making payments for a

fractional part of a month one-thirtieth of one of such installments, or of a monthly compensation, shall be the daily rate of pay. Any person entering or quitting the service of the Territory during a calendar month shall receive compensation for the actual number of days, including holidays, that he was in such service. One day's pay shall be deducted for each day an employee is absent without leave.

## CHAPTER 69.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 57]

To authorize the purchase of a residence for the Kanakanak School District and making an appropriation therefor.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900.00) is hereby appropriated, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, for the purchase of a building to be used as a residence for the teacher of the Kanakanak School District, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Commissioner of Education with the approval of the Governor.

## CHAPTER 70.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 66]

To permit the removal and shipment from the Territory of Alaska, dead bodies buried in cemeteries in abandoned Military Reservations in the Territory of Alaska, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. All dead bodies buried in cemeteries at abandoned Military Reservations within the Territory
