

fractional part of a month one-thirtieth of one of such installments, or of a monthly compensation, shall be the daily rate of pay. Any person entering or quitting the service of the Territory during a calendar month shall receive compensation for the actual number of days, including holidays, that he was in such service. One day's pay shall be deducted for each day an employee is absent without leave.

CHAPTER 69.

AN ACT

[H. B. 57]

To authorize the purchase of a residence for the Kanakanak School District and making an appropriation therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900.00) is hereby appropriated, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, for the purchase of a building to be used as a residence for the teacher of the Kanakanak School District, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Commissioner of Education with the approval of the Governor.

CHAPTER 70.

AN ACT

[H. B. 66]

To permit the removal and shipment from the Territory of Alaska, dead bodies buried in cemeteries in abandoned Military Reservations in the Territory of Alaska, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. All dead bodies buried in cemeteries at abandoned Military Reservations within the Territory

of Alaska may be removed therefrom, or shipped out of the Territory of Alaska by any person or corporation, when, and in such manner, as the Secretary of War may authorize or direct.

Section 2. The provisions of Chapter 35 of the Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska of 1913, and Chapter 47 of the Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska of 1915, shall not apply to the removal or shipment out of the Territory of such dead bodies. Other specified laws not to apply.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.

CHAPTER 71.

AN ACT

[H. B. 68]

To reimburse Norman L. Wimmler for traveling expenses paid by him on behalf of the Territory in connection with making mining investigations in Alaska.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Whereas, Norman L. Wimmler was engaged as placer mining engineer in making mining investigations in Alaska during the year 1926 under the terms of the cooperative arrangement authorized by Chapter 33, Session Laws of 1925 (H. B. No. 42), and, Appropriation reimbursing Norman L. Wimmler for traveling expenses disallowed by U. S. Geological Survey.

Whereas, he was directed by the Supervising Mining Engineer of the Geological Survey to proceed from his domicile at Berkeley, California, to Alaska in May 1926, and did so proceed at the expense of the Geological Survey, and with the express understanding
