

CHAPTER 76.

AN ACT

[H. B. 50]

To authorize advertisement of the advantages of construction of the proposed International Highway between Fairbanks, Alaska, and Seattle, Washington, and making an appropriation for the expenses of such advertisement.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska, created by Act of Congress approved May 14, 1906 is hereby authorized to advertise the advantages of construction of the proposed automobile highway between Fairbanks, Alaska, and Seattle, Washington, through Yukon Territory and British Columbia, in such manner as such Commission may deem advisable and to expend therefor not to exceed the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars, during the period May 1, 1929, to March 31, 1931, inclusive, which amount is hereby appropriated for that purpose, out of any moneys in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated.

Section 2. The Treasurer is authorized to make payments from this fund upon presentation of vouchers approved by the President of the Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska.

CHAPTER 77.

AN ACT

[H. B. 69]

To amend Section 434 of Compiled Laws of Alaska by authorizing marriages to be solemnized by certain officers of the Salvation Army.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 434 of Compiled Laws of Alaska is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

“Any commissioned officer of the Salvation Army holding a commission as such issued by the Commissioner of such Army in charge of the work of the Salvation Army in the Territory shall be considered authorized to solemnize marriages in the Territory under the provisions of this section.”

CHAPTER 78.

AN ACT

[H. B. 79]

Authorizing the Territorial Treasurer to make refund of unused license moneys to the Booth Fisheries Company, W. F. Brown, Alaska General Fisheries, Premier Salmon Co., Cordova Packing Co., Libby, McNeill & Libby, J. G. Collias, San Juan Fishing & Packing Co., Hemrich Packing Co., Hanley & Most and Michael A. Jacobs, making an appropriation therefor and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, it appears that the Booth Fisheries Company paid to the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska the sum of \$200 for trap license No. 28-036; that W. F.
