CHAPTER 78.

AN ACT

[H. B. 79]

Authorizing the Territorial Treasurer to make refund of unused license moneys to the Booth Fisheries Company, W. F. Brown, Alaska General Fisheries, Premier Salmon Co., Cordova Packing Co., Libby, McNeill & Libby, J. G. Collias, San Juan Fishing & Packing Co., Hemrich Packing Co., Hanley & Most and Michael A. Jacobs, making an appropriation therefor and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, it appears that the Booth Fisheries Company paid to the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska the sum of \$200 for trap license No. 28-036; that W. F. Brown paid the Territorial Treasurer the sum of \$50 for trap license No. 29-387; that Alaska General Fisheries paid the Territorial Treasurer \$50 for trap license No. 28-648, \$50 for trap license No. 28-694; that Premier Salmon Company paid the Territorial Treasurer \$200 for trap license No. 28-162; that Cordova Packing Company paid the Territorial Treasurer \$200 for trap license No. 28-454; that Libby, McNeill and Libby paid the Territorial Treasurer \$50 for trap license No. 29-211, \$50 for trap license No. 29-410, \$50 for trap license No. 29-407; that J. G. Collias paid the Territorial Treasurer \$50 for trap license No. 29-552, \$50 for trap license No. 29-553; that San Juan Fishing

and Packing Company paid the Territorial Treasurer \$200 for trap license No. 28-098, \$200 for trap license No. 28-104, \$200 for trap license No. 28-588, \$50 for trap license No. 28-776; that Hemrich Packing Company paid the Territorial Treasurer \$50 for trap license No. 28-774, \$50 for trap license No. 28-745; that Michael A. Jacobs paid the Territorial Treasurer \$50 for trap license No. 29-388, that Hanley and Most paid the Territorial Treasurer Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for trap license No. 28-200, and

Whereas, after the issuance of said fish trap licenses, the War Department refused to issue permits for the construction and maintenance of said traps, and as a consequence, the said licensees were prohibited from installing or using traps upon the locations described in said licenses, Therefore,

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska is hereby authorized to refund to the Booth Fisheries the sum of \$200, to W. F. Brown the sum of \$50, to Alaska General Fisheries the sum of \$100, to Premier Salmon Co. the sum of \$200, to Cordova Packing Co. the sum of \$200, to Libby, McNeill & Libby the sum of \$150, to J. G. Collias the sum of \$100, to San Juan Fishing and Packing Company the sum of \$650, to Hemrich Packing Company the sum of \$100, to Hanley and Most, the sum of \$200 and to Michael A. Jacobs the sum of \$50 out of the moneys of the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

How paid.

Appropriation.

Section 2. The sum of \$2000 is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Act.

Emergency.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage and approval.
