

CHAPTER 87.

AN ACT

[H. B. 67]

To amend Section 1923 of Compiled Laws of Alaska as amended by Chapter 14 of the Laws of 1925.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 1923 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska as amended by Chapter 14 of the Laws of 1925 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Larceny of certain animals defined and penalty fixed.

“Section 1923. That if any person shall commit the crime of larceny by stealing any horse, gelding, mare, colt, mule, ass, jenny, bull, steer, cow, calf, goat, sheep, reindeer, fox, dog or other animal such person, upon conviction thereof shall be punished as follows: If the property so stolen shall exceed in value Fifty Dollars, by imprisonment in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than ten years; but if the property so stolen shall not exceed in value Fifty Dollars, by imprisonment in jail not less than one month nor more than one year, or by fine not less than Twenty-five nor more than One Hundred Dollars.”

CHAPTER 88.

AN ACT

[H. B. 71]

Declaring certain fur-bearing and game animals personal property.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Ownership retained in escaped fur-bearers.

Section 1. All fur bearing or game animals once in captivity and capable of identification are personal property and, wherever found, such animals or their pelts may be claimed and seized by their owners.
