

## CHAPTER 89.

## AN ACT

[H. B. 72]

To protect fur farms against trespass or molestation.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Any person other than the fur farmer himself or his duly authorized agent, on his own fur farm, who takes or attempts to take, capture or kill any animal of any kind on any fur farm, or who shall set any trap on said fur farm, or place poison thereon, or who shall fire or discharge any gun or any fire-arms thereon, or who shall shoot at any bird or animal on such farm, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) or by imprisonment in jail for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Trespass upon fur farms.

Penalty.

Section 2. Any dog running at large on any fur farm may be killed by the owner or agent of such fur farm.

Dog trespassing may be killed.

## CHAPTER 90.

## AN ACT

[H. B. 73]

Appropriating \$40,000 to be expended in cleaning streams and for the destruction of predatory enemies of the salmon, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That there is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the Territory of Alaska the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) to be expended

Appropriation for cleaning salmon streams.

under the direction of the Governor of Alaska, for the cleaning of salmon spawning streams and for the destruction of trout and other predatory enemies of the salmon.

Governor to contract with Bureau of Fisheries for work.

Section 2. The Governor of the Territory of Alaska is hereby authorized to enter into agreement with the United States Bureau of Fisheries whereby transportation of men and the costs of supervision of the work done under the above appropriation may be undertaken by said Bureau of Fisheries.

Residents only hired.

Section 3. It is further provided that no person not a bona fide resident of the Territory of Alaska shall be employed under the provisions of this Act.

Emergency.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 91.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 91]

To provide for the distribution and growing of wild rice in Alaska, making an appropriation therefor and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Governor to purchase wild rice for wild fowl.

Section 1. That the Governor of the Territory of Alaska is hereby authorized and directed to purchase not more than 1000 pounds of wild rice to be distributed and sown in such parts of Alaska as in his judgment are well suited for the growing of wild rice and for habitation and nesting places of wild fowl.

By whom and when distributed.

Section 2. The Governor of Alaska shall cause the wild rice so purchased by him to be distributed in the
