

## Senate Concurrent Resolutions

### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and the House of Representatives concurring, that a joint session of the Senate and the House of said Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, be held in the Hall of the House at 2 o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday, the 6th day of March, A. D. 1929, for the purpose of receiving the message of the Governor of the Territory of Alaska.

Passed the Senate, March 5, 1929.

### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the Territory of Alaska, the House of Representatives concurring,

That the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska are hereby requested to make an investigation of the immediate road needs of Yakutat, between the old and new village, distance about one mile, and that when preparing the annual road program of the First Division this project be given the same consideration as other similar projects.

### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

WHEREAS, it has been customary for a Joint Committee of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Territorial Legislature to visit the Alaska Pioneers' Home, at Sitka, for the purpose of looking into the management thereof and investigating the needs of the institution; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary and proper that such a visit be made during this session for the purposes hereinabove set forth;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the House of Representatives concurring, that a Joint Committee, to consist of four members of the Senate and eight members of the House, be appointed to visit the Alaska Pioneers' Home during this, the Ninth, Session of the Legislature, with instructions to look into the management of the institution and the needs thereof, and to report its findings and recommendations, if any, to both Houses of the Legislature, at an early date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said Committee shall be authorized, if necessary, to hold hearings, summon witnesses, administer oaths to such witnesses, and take their testimony, as provided by Chapter 6, Session Laws of Alaska, 1917.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee be authorized to arrange for the necessary transportation for carrying out the provisions of this Resolution.
