

“Section 37. As soon as the members of the school board have been elected and qualified, they shall send to the Commissioner of Education, to be filed in his office, a certificate of their election, under the hand and seal of the judges or supervisors of the election, their oaths of office, and the bond of the Treasurer, to be approved by the Attorney General. The Commissioner of Education shall keep said papers as a part of the files and records of his office and shall transmit to the Auditor of the Territory a certified copy of the order establishing the district and of the bond of the Treasurer.”

Certificate of election of Board to be filed with Commissioner of Education.

Treasurer's bond approved.

Certified copy of order etc. to be filed with Auditor.

CHAPTER 105.

AN ACT

[S. B. 77]

To amend Section 94, Chapter 97 Session Laws of Alaska of 1929, relative to the duty of school boards.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Section 94 of Chapter 97, Session Laws of Alaska, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 94, Chap. 97, S.L.A. 1929 amended.

“Section 94. No territorial funds shall be transmitted to the Treasurer of any school district or school board until such Treasurer has executed his bond in due form, as required by law, which bond shall be approved by the Attorney General and filed with the Commissioner of Education and a copy of it certified to by the Commissioner, shall be filed in the office of the Territorial Auditor. Hereafter no bond of such school treasurers need be filed with or approved by the clerk of the District Court.

Territorial money only payable when--

No territorial funds shall be paid to any school board or to any teacher who fails to comply with the school laws of the Territory of Alaska or with the rules and

regulations promulgated by the Territorial Board of Education, or by the Commissioner of Education."

Budget and estimates filed with Commissioner of Education, in duplicate, copy to Auditor.

All budgets and all estimates of cost for the school year made by school boards under the requirements of law, or required by rules promulgated by the Territorial Board of Education, shall be filed with the Commissioner of Education and shall be submitted in duplicate to the Commissioner and, after his approval of such budget or estimate, a copy thereof, as approved by him, shall be by the Commissioner of Education, filed by [with] the Territorial Auditor.

## CHAPTER 106.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 78]

To amend subsection (9) of Section 6 of Chapter 118 Session Laws of Alaska, 1929, relative to inventories.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Subsection 9, Sec. 6, Chap. 118, S.L.A. 1929 amended.

Section 1. Subsection (9) of Section 6 of Chapter 118, Session Laws of Alaska, 1929, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Perpetual inventory of Territorial property.

"(9). Each Territorial officer, board, institution or agency, having in his or its possession property of the Territory of Alaska, shall keep a perpetual card inventory of all permanent property and equipment under his or its control, and shall on or before the first day of January, 1932, file duplicate cards with the Auditor, showing all permanent property and equipment on hand, the date of acquisition, and the cost thereof, and when any property is dropped or eliminated from the inventory, the date and cause of the elimination. Such inventories shall be made and kept in the form and manner that may be prescribed by the Governor."
