

CHAPTER 11.

AN ACT

[H. B. 20]

To provide for the recovery of public money, funds, or other property illegally paid or diverted, and to repeal all Acts and parts of Acts in conflict herewith.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Recovery of public money, funds or property illegally paid or diverted.

Section 1. That whenever any money, funds, or property of any nature belonging to a city, school district, municipal government, or the Territory of Alaska shall have been illegally paid or diverted for any illegal purpose, or to any person not authorized by law to receive the same, the same may be recovered for the benefit of such city, school district, municipal government, or Territory, to which such money, funds or property may belong, by an action instituted by the Attorney General of the Territory of Alaska, provided, however, that when it shall appear to him that it will be more advantageous to begin or conduct said suit through additional counsel, he may choose and authorize such additional counsel to bring said suit in the name of the proper party.

Costs and attorney fees to be paid by Territory.

Section 2. The necessary and reasonable costs of said suit, or suits, and of said additional counsel, shall be advanced and paid by the Territory of Alaska, and any sums recovered in said suit shall be covered into the Treasury of Alaska. Provided, however, that if said sum recovered belongs to any city, school district, or municipal government, the same shall be transferred to it, minus any sums advanced by the Territory of Alaska in the suit, and not already repaid to it, and the Territorial Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay to any such city, school district or municipal corporation the sums so belonging to it or them, upon warrants drawn as pro-

vided by law, such warrants to be based upon vouchers approved by the Attorney General of Alaska.

Section 3. All Acts or parts of Acts in conflict here- Repeal.
with are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 12.

AN ACT

[H. B. 5]

To preserve the food supply of Alaska, placing a bounty on certain wild animals and providing payment of same and repealing Chapter 117 of the Session Laws of 1929, providing a penalty, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby placed upon every wild lobo or timber wolf and every wild coyote or prairie wolf within the Territory a bounty of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00), said sum to be paid in accordance with the provisions of this Act. Bounty on wolves and coyotes.

Section 2. To obtain such bounties any person killing a wolf or coyote within the Territory shall, as soon as reasonably possible, exhibit the pelt or pelts of such animals to any United States Commissioner, or to any Postmaster, in any community where there is no Commissioner, together with an affidavit in substantially the following form: Obtain bounty, how.
