

an Act of the Congress of the United States approved February 20, 1931.

Section 5. That of the sum hereby appropriated Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) shall be available for cooperative extension work either as supplementary or offset funds, under the provisions of an Act of the Congress of the United States approved May 8, 1914, and commonly known as the Smith-Lever Act. Cooperative extension work under provisions Smith-Lever Act.

Section 6. The balance of the appropriation, or the sum of One Hundred Fourteen Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Dollars, (\$114,420.00) shall be available for the maintenance, improvement and conduct of the college. Balance for maintenance etc.

Section 7. That during the period covered by the school years 1931-1932 and 1932-1933 no indebtedness or obligation shall be incurred by said Agricultural College and School of Mines, over and above the amount appropriated by this Act. Limit of indebtedness.

Section 8. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.

CHAPTER 113.

AN ACT

[H. B. 109]

To amend Section 4, Chapter 56, Session Laws of Alaska of 1919, relating to abatement of gambling places.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 4 of Chapter 56 of the Session Laws of 1919, is hereby amended to read as follows: Sec. 4, Chap. 56, S.L.A. 1919 amended.

'Section 4. That the United States Attorney, or any of his assistants, may maintain an action in equity Action to abate and enjoin nuisance.

in the District Court of the Division of the Territory of Alaska in which such gambling nuisance, as defined in the last preceding section, exists or is maintained, to abate and enjoin the same, and upon notice and good cause shown a temporary injunction may be granted after the commencement of the action and no bond shall be required. Any person who violates the terms of such injunction shall be punished for contempt by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the Federal Jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, in the discretion of the court. Provided, however, that no action shall be maintained under this section unless a conviction has first been secured.

CHAPTER 114.

AN ACT

[H. B. 101]

To provide for stocking of lakes and streams in Alaska with game fish, providing for protecting of such fish, making an appropriation to carry out the provisions hereof, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Game fish
stocking
program.

Section 1. There is hereby adopted a program of stocking lakes and streams in Alaska with game fish which program shall be divided into the following projects.

(a) Lakes and streams adjacent to the Alaska Railroad.

(b) Lakes and streams adjacent to the Richardson Highway.

(c) Lakes and streams adjacent to the Steese Highway.
