in the District Court of the Division of the Territory of Alaska in which such gambling nuisance, as defined in the last preceding section, exists or is maintained, to abate and enjoin the same, and upon notice and good cause shown a temporary injunction may be granted after the commencement of the action and no bond shall be required. Any person who violates the terms of such injunction shall be punished for contempt by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the Federal Jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, in the discretion of the court. Provided, however, that no action shall be maintained under this section unless a conviction has first been secured.

CHAPTER 114.

AN ACT

[H. B. 101]

To provide for stocking of lakes and streams in Alaska with game fish, providing for protecting of such fish, making an appropriation to carry out the provisions hereof, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Game fish
stocking
program.

Section 1. There is hereby adopted a program of stocking lakes and streams in Alaska with game fish which program shall be divided into the following projects.

- (a) Lakes and streams adjacent to the Alaska Railroad.
- (b) Lakes and streams adjacent to the Richardson Highway.
- (c) Lakes and streams adjacent to the Steese Highway.

Section 2. The Alaska Game Commission is hereby authorized and it shall be their duty to carry out such projects by obtaining the spawn of desirable game fish, caring for same, transporting and planting same in the lakes and streams as herein directed. The projects shall be undertaken in such order as the Game Commission deems best.

Alaska Game Commission to have charge of work.

Section 3. The sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) is hereby appropriated out of the General Funds in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this Act, and shall be available upon the approval of this Act until expended. All funds disbursed under the provisions of this Act shall be disbursed by the Alaska Game Commission, upon the approval of the Auditor of Alaska.

Section 4. The fish introduced and liberated under the provisions of this Act shall be the property of the Territory of Alaska and it shall be unlawful for any person to take or attempt to take, capture or kill or hinder in any way the same for a period of three years after liberation. And any person violating the provisions hereof shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, nor more than five hundred (\$500.00) dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Fish protected for 3 years.

Penalty for violation this section.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
