

## CHAPTER 122.

## AN ACT

[H. B. 106]

To provide for co-operation between the Territory and Federal Government in the investigation of mineral resources and the dissemination of information concerning the same, making an appropriation therefor, suspending Chapter 44 of the Laws of 1921, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Governor to cooperate with federal departments for mining investigations.

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Governor of the Territory to co-operate with the heads of any of the executive departments of the United States in making investigations and in disseminating information with the view to stimulate mining, quarrying and metallurgical industries in the Territory, and to provide for the inspection of mines and the protection of the lives of miners. The work contemplated herein shall be carried on under the Supervising Mining Engineer of the United States Geological Survey and the Bureau of Mines for Alaska.

Work to be carried on by—

Supervising Mining Engineer has authority to—

Section 2. Subject to the approval of the Governor the Supervising Mining Engineer of the United States in Alaska shall have authority to engage technical assistants and other experts, hire clerk, and other necessary stenographic assistant, prepare and print reports, blank forms and stationery, and pay necessary contingent office and field expenses, including wages and expenses of men employed in the field, and a proper share of traveling expenses incurred by the Supervising Mining Engineer and his assistants in performing the duties contemplated by this Act including such traveling expenses within Alaska as may be necessary and properly performed in said duties; provided, that wages, salaries or expenses shall be paid only for services rendered or performed within the Territory of Alaska, excepting that travel expense may be allowed from the United States to Alaska and return to any technical experts hired under this Act.

Proviso.

Section 3. The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (Appropriation. \$25,000.00), or so much thereof as shall be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the Territory not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of paying the expenses incurred under this Act, which expenses may be paid out of said appropriation on Disbursement. vouchers approved by the Governor.

Section 4. Chapter 44 of the Laws of 1921 is hereby Chap. 44, S.L.A. 1921 suspended for 1931-1933 biennium. suspended for the biennium April 30, 1931 to April 30, 1933. Provided, however, that the Supervising Mining Engineer shall perform the duties imposed on the Territorial Mine Inspector under the provisions of Proviso. Chapter .... Session Laws of 1931. (Senate Bill No. 60).

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist Emergency. and this Act shall take effect from and after its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 123.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 114]

To provide methods for obtaining bounty on wolves and coyotes and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Any person who is or may be entitled to any bounty under the provisions of chapter 117 of the laws of 1929, or who is or may be entitled to any bounty under the provisions of Chapter 12 of the laws of 1931, for killing any wolf or coyote, shall be paid the bounty whether the proof of his right thereto is made in conformity to the said Act of 1929 or in conformity to the provisions of chapter 12 of the laws of 1931. Proof in re wolf or coyote bounty may be made under—

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist Emergency. and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
