

Section 3. The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (Appropriation. \$25,000.00), or so much thereof as shall be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the Territory not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of paying the expenses incurred under this Act, which expenses may be paid out of said appropriation on Disbursement. vouchers approved by the Governor.

Section 4. Chapter 44 of the Laws of 1921 is hereby Chap. 44, S.L.A. 1921 suspended for 1931-1933 biennium. suspended for the biennium April 30, 1931 to April 30, 1933. Provided, however, that the Supervising Mining Engineer shall perform the duties imposed on the Territorial Mine Inspector under the provisions of Proviso. Chapter Session Laws of 1931. (Senate Bill No. 60).

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist Emergency. and this Act shall take effect from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 123.

AN ACT

[H. B. 114]

To provide methods for obtaining bounty on wolves and coyotes and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Any person who is or may be entitled to any bounty under the provisions of chapter 117 of the laws of 1929, or who is or may be entitled to any bounty under the provisions of Chapter 12 of the laws of 1931, for killing any wolf or coyote, shall be paid the bounty whether the proof of his right thereto is made in conformity to the said Act of 1929 or in conformity to the provisions of chapter 12 of the laws of 1931. Proof in re wolf or coyote bounty may be made under—

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist Emergency. and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
