

CHAPTER 13.

AN ACT

[S. B. 6]

To appropriate the sum of Twenty-six Hundred and Five Dollars (\$2605.00) to reimburse George H. Wagner for monies expended in accompanying Dr. L. E. Benson to require the native in northern Alaska to submit to vaccination during the winter of 1928-29, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation
reimbursing
George H.
Wagner.

Section 1. The sum of Twenty-six Hundred and Five Dollars (\$2605.00) is hereby appropriated out of any monies in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska, not otherwise appropriated, as repayment to George H. Wagner, for monies expended by him in defraying the expenses incidental to vaccinating the natives in Noatak, Kobuk and Selawik sections of Alaska during the winter of 1928-29.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 14.

AN ACT

[S. B. 9]

To reimburse Harry Gavin of Taylor, Alaska, for services rendered in connection with the death and burial of John Rothler, and making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation
reimbursing
Harry Gavin.

Section 1. That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, out of the general funds in the Territorial Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Two Hundred Eighty-four (\$284.00) Dollars, to reimburse Harry Gavin of Taylor, Alaska, for services rendered

in connection with the death and burial of John Rothler who died at Taylor, Alaska, about February 24, 1929, and who was a total stranger to the above mentioned Harry Gavin; said Harry Gavin making the trip from Taylor, Alaska, to Nome, Alaska, in midwinter with a dog team to notify the nearest United States Commissioner, a distance of one hundred eighty miles and returning to Taylor and taking body of said deceased and hauling same to Hot Springs, Alaska, a distance of about eighty miles, and there burying said remains and returning to Taylor, Alaska, paying his own expenses on trail and paying for help in digging grave and making coffin.

Section 2. That said Harry Gavin shall not be required to furnish itemized vouchers for his expenses in connection with above services. Itemized vouchers not necessary.

Section 3. The Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska is hereby authorized to pay the amount herein above specified to the said Harry Gavin. Treasurer authorized to pay the amount.

Section 4. That an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.

CHAPTER 15.

AN ACT

[S. B. 7]

To amend Section 739 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska relating to personal property that may be mortgaged.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

That Section 739 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska be, and it is hereby, amended to read as follows: Sec. 739, C.L.A., amended.

“Section 739. Any interest in personal property which is capable of being transferred, growing crops Mortgage of personal property.
