

United States all of Lot No. 4 in Block No. 8 of the City of Juneau, Alaska, hereinabove referred to, without cost to the United States, provided the United States acquires, within two years from the time this Act goes into effect, for the purpose of enlarging the site of the Federal and Territorial Building, the remainder of said Block No. 8; and the Governor is hereby authorized and empowered to execute the necessary conveyance or conveyances to the United States on behalf of the Territory of Alaska. Proviso.

CHAPTER 27.

AN ACT

[S. B. 45]

To amend Section 11, of Chapter 13, of the Session Laws of Alaska of 1919, relating to contracts of conditional sales, and providing for the punishment for violations thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 11, of Chapter 13, of the Session Laws of 1919 be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows: Sec. 11, Chap. 13, S.L.A. 1919, amended.

“Section 11. (Refiling). The filing of conditional sales contracts provided for in Sections 5, 6 and 7 shall be valid for the period of one year only. The filing of the contract provided for in Section 8 shall be valid for a period of ten years only. The validity of the filing may in each case be extended for successive additional periods of one year from the date of refiling by filing in the proper district within thirty days next preceding the expiration of each period an affidavit made by the seller, or his agent, showing that the contract is in force and the amount remaining to be paid thereon, and such affidavit shall be filed and entered in the same manner as a contract or copy filed and entered Refiling of contracts of conditional sales.

CHAPTER 28.

AN ACT

[S. B. 23]

To amend Chapter 8 of the Laws of Alaska of 1917 relative to license for practicing medicine and surgery and the revocation of such license.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 7 of Chapter 8 of the Laws of Alaska of 1917, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 7, Chap. 8,
S.L.A. 1917,
amended.

Tax.

"On or before the first day of February of each year the licensee shall pay to the Territory a tax of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) which sum shall be remitted to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Board of Medical Examiners, who shall give his receipt therefor and transmit to the Territory the taxes so received. Any license now legally in existence or that may hereafter be issued may be revoked by the Board for failure on the part of the licensee to pay said tax, or for unprofessional conduct, as hereinafter defined."

Section 2. That Section 9 of Chapter 8 of the Laws of Alaska of 1917 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

Sec. 9, Chap. 8,
S.L.A. 1917,
amended.

"In the event the annual tax is not paid within the time provided in Section 7 of this Act, the Secretary-Treasurer of the Board shall give the licensee written notice that he is in default. Such notice may be served on him personally or sent him by registered mail addressed to his last known place of residence. If he shall fail to pay his tax within three (3) months after
