

proper rate of taxation, the graduation of same and the probable revenue to be derived from such a tax. He shall examine and compare the laws of the Federal Government, and such of the various State laws as may be available, providing for Income Taxes, and from all the information obtainable cause an Act suitable to the needs of the Territory to be drafted and, together with a report of his investigations, presented to the next Legislature of the Territory of Alaska for introduction.

CHAPTER 35.

AN ACT

[S. B. 32]

To appropriate funds for payment of deficiencies in the conduct of Territorial Offices, and declaring an emergency.

Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as shall be required, are hereby appropriated out of funds not otherwise appropriated from the Treasury of the Territory for the following purposes:

To carry out the provisions of the Live Stock Inspection Act (Chapter 55 Laws of 1919 as amended)	\$1298.67	Livestock.
Care of Dependent Children including allowances to Mothers and for other incidentals..	\$6255.00	Dependent Children.
To office of Auditor as follows:		Auditor's Office.
For additional and necessary clerical help....	\$1403.25	
For contingent expenses, telephone, lights, etc.	\$ 517.22	
For cooperative mining investigations	\$ 350.00	Mining.
For payment salary Territorial Highway Engineer, March, 1931	\$ 333.33	Highway Engineer.

For payment of traveling and contingent expenses in the office of Territorial Highway Engineer, March, 1931\$ 69.60

School tuition. For payment of additional tuition for pupils living outside of incorporated cities\$1,000.00

These appropriations are supplementary to the appropriations heretofore made for the same purpose for the biennium which ended March 31st, 1931, and are made for the purpose of supplying deficiencies therein.

Emergency. Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 36.

AN ACT

[S. B. 36]

To amend Section 967 and Section 968 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, relating to attachment, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Sec. 967, C.L.A.,
amended.

Section 1. That Section 967 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska is hereby amended to read as follows:

Attachment
for satisfaction
of judgment,
unless—

“Section 967. The plaintiff, at the time of issuing the summons, or at any time afterwards, may have the property of the defendant attached as security for the satisfaction of any judgment that may be recovered, unless the defendant give security to pay such judgment, as in this chapter provided, in the following cases;

First. In an action upon a contract, express or implied, for the direct payment of money, and which is not secured by mortgage, lien, or pledge upon real or personal property, or, if so secured, when such
