

cial Divisions of Alaska, the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners is hereby authorized to expend the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) or as much thereof as may be required, for the purpose of rehabilitating and maintaining the abandoned U. S. Signal Corps telegraph line between Tanana and Unalakleet for use as a public telephone line. The work done within each Division shall be charged against the general road appropriation for such division and shall not exceed the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for the Second Division nor Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the Fourth Division.

Expense out of road funds of Second and Fourth Divisions.

Board authorized to:

Section 2. Said Board is authorized to have such work done either by contract or by force account using such agency or agencies as it shall see fit; to purchase such equipment as may be necessary; to fix the rates to be charged for service on said line and to promulgate such rules and regulations for the use thereof as may be required to protect and maintain it as a public telephone line.

Payment.

Payments made under this Act shall be upon vouchers approved by the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners.

CHAPTER 39.

AN ACT

[H. B. 9]

For refund to James Kennedy for payment of money advanced to T. J. Kinney a Territorial pensioner, now deceased, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation to James Kennedy.

Section 1. That there is hereby appropriated from the moneys in the treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Sixty Dollars

(\$60.00) to be paid to James Kennedy of Anchorage, Alaska, as a refund for payment of money advanced to T. J. Kinney, a Territorial pensioner, now deceased, who authorized the payment of warrant number 1310 to James Kennedy, for value received, before he, the said Kinney, left for the hills on a prospecting trip and where he met his death, payment of the above stated pension warrant being refused by the Territorial Treasurer by reason of the said Kinney's endorsement thereon being lacking.

Section 2. This Act shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.

CHAPTER 40.

AN ACT

[H. B. 11]

To reimburse St. Ann's Hospital, Juneau, Alaska, for hospitalization of Abraham Peterson and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of funds in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,536.00 as remuneration in full, for St. Ann's Hospital of Juneau, Alaska, for hospitalization of Abraham Peterson from June 27, 1929 to May 1, 1931, and the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska is directed to pay the said sum to the said hospital. Appropriation reimbursing St. Ann's Hospital.

Section 2. That the Board of Trustees of the Pioneer's Home is hereby authorized to assume the care of the said Abraham Peterson and to provide medical and hospital treatment for him. Further hospitalization to be paid, how.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.
