

## CHAPTER 51.

## AN ACT

[H. B. 17]

To amend Sections 1 and 2, Chapter 68, of the Laws of 1929, fixing the time public offices shall be open for business and providing for annual and sick leave.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

That Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter 68 of the Laws of 1929 are hereby amended so as to read as follows: Secs. 1 and 2, Chap. 68, S.L.A. 1929, amended.

“Section 1. All Territorial offices shall be open for business every day from 9 o'clock until 12 o'clock in the forenoon and from 1 o'clock until 5 o'clock in the afternoon except on Sundays and legal holidays, and except Saturday afternoons. Territorial office hours and holidays fixed.

Section 2. The head of any Territorial office may grant thirty working days annual leave of absence with pay in any one year to each clerk or employee of such Territorial office. Annual leave.

Where some member of the immediate family of a clerk or employee is afflicted with a contagious disease and requires the care and attendance of such employee, or where his or her presence in the office would jeopardize the health of fellow clerks, and in exceptional meritorious cases where a clerk or employee is personally ill, and where to limit the annual leave to thirty working days in any one calendar year would work peculiar hardship, it may be extended in the discretion of the head of the office, with pay, not exceeding two weeks in any one case or in any one calendar year. This section shall not be construed to prevent the head of any executive office from granting thirty working days annual leave with pay in any one year to a clerk or employee, notwithstanding such clerk or employee may have had during such year not exceeding two weeks leave with pay on account of sickness. Nor shall it be construed to mean that so long Sick leave not bar to annual leave.

as a clerk or employe is borne upon the rolls of the office in excess of the time herein provided for or granted that he or she shall be entitled to pay during the period of such excessive absence, but that the pay shall stop upon the expiration of the granted leave. Provided, further that the head of any Territorial office shall not grant such annual leave or leaves on account of illness if it will in any manner result in the necessity of hiring additional or other help to take the place of any employe during such absence."

## CHAPTER 52.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 18]

For the rehabilitation and maintenance of telephone lines on Seward Peninsula, between Nome and Shelton, between Nome-Solomon-Council and Golovin, between Solomon and Bluff, between Candle and Deering and between Candle and Keewalik; making an appropriation of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) therefor, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That the sum of \$5,000.00, is hereby appropriated, or so much thereof as may be required to be expended by the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners in cooperation with the Alaska Road Commission for necessary labor and material for rehabilitating and maintaining permanent telephone lines and connections between Nome and Shelton, between Nome-Solomon-Council and Golovin, between Solomon and Bluff, between Candle and Deering, between Candle and Keewalik, on the Seward Peninsula during the twenty-four months beginning July 1st, 1931, and ending June 30, 1933, provided that any expenditures that may be made upon any privately owned lines for rehabilitation or maintenance of same, be made only upon condition
