presentation, shall be guilty of larceny. If the value of the consideration given for said check or draft be fifty dollars or less, he shall be punished by imprisonment in jail for not less than one month nor more than one year or by fine not less than twenty-five nor more than one hundred dollars; and if the value of the consideration given for said check or draft be more than fifty dollars, he shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than ten years. The word "credit" as used herein shall be construed to mean an arrangement or understanding with the bank for payment of such check or draft, and the uttering or delivery of such a check or draft to another person without such fund or credit to meet the same shall be prima facie evidence of an intent to defraud.

CHAPTER 54.

AN ACT

[H. B. 51]

To appropriate Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) to purchase living quarters for public school teacher at Ruby, Alaska, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation
for cabin for
teacher's living
quarters at
Ruby.

Section 1. The sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), or as much thereof as shall be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Treasury of the Territory for the purpose of purchasing a cabin for living quarters for the public school teacher at Ruby, Alaska. The purchase of such cabin shall be under the direction of the Commissioner of Education and payment under this appropriation shall be made upon voucher approved by the Commissioner of Education.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.

CHAPTER 55.

AN ACT

[H. B. 54]

To provide for the disposal of property of defunct schools or school districts.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. All property whether real or personal belonging to any school or school district instituted and maintained by the Territory, but which shall have been permanently closed, may be disposed of by sale or otherwise, or transferred to some other school or school district, as the Territorial Board of Education shall find of greatest advantage to the Territory. All expenses connected with the transfer or transportation of such property may be paid out of appropriations for maintaining schools outside of incorporated cities or incorporated school district. Providing disposal of property of defunct schools.
Expenses, how paid.

Section 2. All monies received for any school property of any kind under the provisions of this Act shall be covered into the Treasury of the Territory for the credit of the permanent school fund. Whenever any sale of real property is made pursuant to the provisions of this Act, the same shall be reported to the Governor who shall execute a deed to the purchaser thereof. Moneys to be covered into Territorial Treasury.
