

sentation obtains aid or assistance under the provisions of this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars, nor more than One Thousand Dollars, or by imprisonment in jail not less than four months nor more than one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 10. The Commissioner shall have authority to promulgate such rules and regulations as deemed necessary for the proper operation of this Act and shall furnish each agent with all necessary blank forms and other papers. Commissioner to promulgate rules, etc.

Section 11. Chapter 18, Session Laws of Alaska, 1927 and Chapter 50 Session Laws of Alaska 1929 are hereby repealed. Repeal.

Section 12. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.

CHAPTER 67.

AN ACT

[S. B. 67]

To appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for improving the grounds about the Governor's Mansion, and declaring an emergency to give this Act immediate effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00), or so much thereof as shall be needed, is hereby appropriated out of the general fund of the Territory not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of improving the grounds about the Governor's Mansion, namely block thirty-two (32) of the official survey of Juneau, Alaska; said sum shall be paid on vouchers approved by the Governor. Appropriation for improvement of grounds at Governor's Mansion.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 68.

AN ACT

[S. B. 69]

Fixing the scale of wages on public construction within the Territory; authorizing the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners to determine the prevailing rate of wages; requiring the Attorney General to enforce the provisions of this Act; requiring filing of report by contractors, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Rate of wage on public construction work in Territory.

Section 1. That every contractor or subcontractor performing work on any public construction within the Territory of Alaska shall pay not less than the prevailing rate of wages for work of a similar nature in the region in which the work is done.

Subcontracts.

Section 2. All sub-contracts performed on any public construction shall be, or may be, reduced to a basis of day labor for the purpose of determining whether or not such sub-contractor or contractors have been paid at not less than the prevailing scale of wage.

Who to determine what constitutes prevailing wage.

Section 3. The Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for the Territory of Alaska is hereby given the authority to say what constitutes the prevailing wage; determine whether or not this law is being violated, and, should this law be violated, the Attorney General shall, when so instructed by the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for the Territory of Alaska, take immediate steps to enforce the provisions of this Act.

Enforcement of Act.
