

CHAPTER 71.

AN ACT

[S. B. 53]

To amend Chapter 62 of the Alaska Session Laws of 1917, entitled "An Act for the establishment of the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Congress approved March 4th, 1915, and to grant a charter to the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines," and declaring an emergency to give this Act immediate effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Sec. 3, Chap. 62,

Section 1. That Section 3 of Chapter 62 of the Alaska Session Laws of 1917 be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

Who to disburse

funds.

"Section 3. (a) The Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines shall hold all property acquired by it and the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska on requisitions by the Board of Trustees of said College duly signed by the President and the Secretary thereof shall pay to the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees all federal land grant college funds coming into his hands by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 34, Session Laws of Alaska, 1917, and subject to requisition by said Board of Trustees and shall disburse federal funds in aid of land grant colleges in accordance with the provisions of the federal statute or statutes providing for such disbursement.

(b) All funds appropriated by the Territorial Legislature for the conduct, maintenance and support of the said college shall, on requisition by the Board of Trustees of the college duly signed by the President and the Secretary thereof, be paid by the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska to the Treasurer of the said Board of Trustees of the college to be by him disbursed on properly drawn vouchers signed by the President and Secretary of the Board of Trustees or by such other administrative officer or officers as

shall be delegated by the Board of Trustees of the said college to perform such services.

(c) A duplicate copy of each and every voucher and a copy of each and every item of cash receipts shall be sent by the President of said college to the Auditor of the Territory of Alaska within six (6) days after the end of each calendar month.

Copy of vouchers, etc. to be filed with Auditor.

(d) The Board of Trustees of said college shall be and hereby is empowered to create the office of Business Manager of said college, fix the salary of said officer, determine his duties, and by a majority vote to fill said office.

(e) The Federal fiscal year shall be the fiscal year of the college; provided, however, that the biennial report required to be submitted to the Territorial Legislature shall be supplemented by a financial report covering the financial transactions from July 1 in each even numbered year to and including January 31 of the year next following.

(f) Requisitions on territorial appropriations shall be based upon estimates of the amounts required quarterly beginning with July 1, 1931.

(g) The Board of Trustees of said college shall initiate and maintain beginning with July 1, 1931, a perpetual card index inventory of all permanent property of the said college showing date of purchase of each item, from whom purchased, amount paid for the same and serial voucher number, and shall furnish duplicate cards on or before October 1st, 1931, to the Auditor for the Territory of Alaska. On the first of each and every month thereafter duplicate cards of new items purchased shall be forwarded to said Auditor together with a statement showing the loss, sale, destruction, or other disposition of any and all items no longer carried on said perpetual inventory. On or before the 15th day of January of each year the said

Board of Trustees shall forward to the Governor of the Territory, the Territorial Treasurer and the Auditor for the Territory of Alaska, a statement showing the inventoried value of the buildings, grounds, library and museum, together with the permanent property of the college charged to its several departments.

Subjects taught.

(h) The Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines shall use the property and funds acquired for the purpose of conducting a college where the leading object shall be, without excluding other scientific and classical studies, and including military tactics, to teach such branches of learning as are related to agriculture, the mechanic arts and household economics, in order to promote a liberal and practical education. All departments of said institution shall be open to both sexes for equal educational opportunities. The said Trustees are hereby empowered to conduct a college extension service, the leading object of which shall be to carry information on rural life subjects to the people of Alaska.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 72.

AN ACT

[S. B. 61]

To organize a Board of Budget for the Territory of Alaska, defining duties, providing penalties for violation of this Act, and repealing Chapter 60 of the Session Laws of Alaska 1925.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:
