

A "stockholder" is the owner of a share or shares of the capital stock.

Benefits of
this Act.

Section 36. The provisions of this Act, where applicable, shall apply to and govern all domestic corporations organized prior to the date when this Act shall go into effect. Every such corporation shall, by the execution and filing of amended articles of incorporation and by amendment of its by-laws, where necessary, in conformity with the provisions hereof, be entitled to all of the benefits of this Act.

Repeal.

Section 37. Chapter 73 of the Session Laws of Alaska of 1923 and Chapter 43 of the Session Laws of Alaska of 1929 are hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not affect any rights acquired or penalties incurred under the provisions of said Acts, nor bar any action arising thereunder, prior to the date when this Act shall go into effect.

Emergency.

Section 38. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT

[S. B. 15]

To amend Chapter 101 Session Laws of Alaska 1929 relative to Boards of Children's Guardians, by adding a new section, to be numbered Section 6, prescribing fees of Commissioners and witnesses.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

That Chapter 101 Session Laws of Alaska, 1929, be amended by adding thereto a new section, to read as follows:

Section 6. In proceedings had under the provisions of this Act, the Commissioners and witnesses shall re-

ceive the same fees as are provided for like services in the trial of misdemeanors before a Justice of the Peace. Such fees to be paid out of the appropriation for the care of dependent children upon vouchers approved by the Governor.

CHAPTER 10.

AN ACT

[S. B. 16]

Authorizing the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for the Territory of Alaska to repair and maintain the Valdez dyke, providing for payment for said work, authorizing a contribution to the same or similar work if done by the United States, or any department, bureau, board or agency thereof, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency to give this Act immediate effect.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for the Territory of Alaska is hereby authorized and empowered to repair from time to time as necessary and to maintain during the years 1931 and 1932, or during such portion of said period as may be necessary, the dyke which partially surrounds the city of Valdez, Alaska, and which was built to protect said city and the property therein situated and the southern terminal of the Richardson Highway from the waters of the stream flowing from the Valdez glacier, in the same manner and to the same extent that said Board may repair and maintain any public road in the Territory of Alaska.

Territorial Board of Road Commissioners authorized repair Valdez dyke.

Section 2. That the expense of the repair and maintenance of said dyke shall be paid from the moneys appropriated by the Legislature of Alaska, and allotted to the Third Division of the Territory of Alaska, for the construction and maintenance of roads, trails, bridges

Money from Third Division road fund and City of Valdez.
