

and further duties as may be required by the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for the Territory of Alaska. Provided, that nothing in this Act shall be construed as including constructions or repairs of school buildings within incorporated cities and incorporated school districts or the construction or repair of school buildings when said construction or repair amounts to less than \$1,000.00 in valuation and, provided further, that the services rendered by the Superintendent of Public Works hereunder shall in no wise conflict with his duties as Territorial Highway Engineer.

Proviso.

Duties not to conflict with—

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 92.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 66]

To create a commission to arrange for the participation of Alaska in the World's Fair at Chicago in 1933, and making an appropriation.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. The Governor shall appoint a commission consisting of five (5) members, two (2) of whom shall be residents of the first judicial division and each of the other judicial divisions shall be represented by one resident as member of the commission.

Creating Alaska World's Fair Commission.

The commission shall be known as the "Alaska World's Fair Commission." Its duty shall be to take the necessary steps and make the proper provisions to have Alaska and its industries represented as well and as extensively as practicable at the World's Fair to be held in Chicago during the year 1933, and to that end it may arrange for Alaska exhibits in conjunction or

co-operation with the federal government. To such ends it shall be the duty of the commission to solicit co-operation from the industries within the Territory.

Authority to incur obligations up to—

Section 2. The commission shall have authority, in carrying out the purpose of this Act, to incur obligations in amounts aggregating not more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) no part of which shall be spent except and until the Governor shall have satisfied himself of the intention of the federal departments or others having an interest in the Alaska exhibit of supplying the remainder of the amount required to make a creditable showing at the said Fair. The sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or as much thereof as shall be needed is hereby appropriated out of the general funds of the Territory not otherwise appropriated, to meet the necessary expenses during the present biennium, which sum shall be paid on vouchers approved by the Governor.

## CHAPTER 93.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 63]

To punish the destroying of shelter cabins and structures, and the destroying, injuring or defacing of signs or signals posted along public highways giving distance, direction, warning or other notice to the public.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Penalty for destroying shelter cabins, road signs, etc.

Section 1. Any person who shall wilfully destroy, injure or deface any sign or signal or shelter cabin erected near or along any public highway designed to aid or inform the travelers on such highway as to distances or directions or giving shelter or warning or notice as to grade, curve or crossing, or otherwise
