

organizations or persons to whom such memorials are addressed, the necessity for the action prayed for in the memorial, and shall submit to the next Legislature, a report on the memorials theretofore passed by previous Legislatures; and all such other duties as may be required by law, or as usually pertain to the office of Attorney-General in a Territory; and he shall make through the Governor, to the Legislature, at each regular session thereof, a report of the work and expenditures of the office, and upon needed legislation or amendments to existing laws."

## CHAPTER 98.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 73]

To amend Section 62 of Chapter 97 of the Laws of 1929 relative to the time and manner of paying to municipalities the refund for maintaining public schools.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Section 62 of Chapter 97 of the Laws of 1929 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

"Provided, further, that the Commissioner of Education shall have authority in his discretion to transmit or cause to be transmitted in the manner above provided, at the beginning of each three months of the school year, and before the expense accounts are received or checked by him, such sum as he shall have reason to believe will not be in excess of the sum which will become due such municipality for such refund, and in no case more than a sum equal to twenty-five percent (25%) of the sum which such municipality received as refund for the previous school year, except that no such advancement or refund shall be made for

the last quarter of the school year. Warrants for the advances herein authorized shall be issued by the Auditor upon requisition of the Commissioner of Education, who shall submit with each requisition a statement showing the gross amount of the budget of the school for the current year, and the amount of the refund for the previous year." Warrants issued, how.

## CHAPTER 99.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 22]

To amend Chapter 31, Session Laws of 1921, as amended by Chapter 101, Session Laws of 1923, as amended by Chapter 70, Session Laws of 1925, as amended by Chapter 59, Session Laws of 1927, being an Act to establish a system of license taxation, and declaring en emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That paragraph (a) of subsection 1st of Section 1 of Chapter 31 of the Laws of 1921, as amended by Chapter 101 of the Laws of 1923, as amended by Chapter 70 of the Laws of 1925, as amended by Chapter 59 of the Laws of 1927, is hereby amended to read as follows: Amendment.

"1st. (a) Attorneys-at-law, chiropractors, osteopaths, optometrists and dentists, ten (\$10.00) dollars per annum. Each member of a firm shall be liable for this tax." Professions.

Section 2. That Subsection 2nd, of Section 1, of Chapter 31 of the Laws of 1921, as amended by Chapter 101 of the Laws of 1923, as amended by Chapter 70, of the Laws of 1925, as amended by Chapter 59 of the Laws of 1927, relative to license tax on automobiles, be and hereby is repealed. Repeal.
