SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 11.

WHEREAS, the tenth session of the Alaska Legislature has met for the first time in the quarters provided for it in the new Federal and Territorial Building at Juneau, Alaska, which said building has been erected by the United States under the supervision of the Honorable Jas. A. Wetmore, Acting Supervising Architect, Treasury Department, and,

WHEREAS, in the said building quarters have been provided for all the Territorial Offices and Bureaus, and the Territorial Museum, which said quarters have been furnished and are now being maintained at the expense of the United States, and,

WHEREAS, the members of the Tenth Alaska Legislature have had their work, during the present session, greatly facilitated through the use of the new quarters and conveniences which have been provided in the said Federal and Territorial Building, and,

WHEREAS, J. C. McBride, Collector of Customs for Alaska, who is the custodian of the said building, has extended every courtesy to the members of the Legislature and has seen that the Legislative chambers, committee rooms and offices have been well taken care of during the entire session,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska extend to the Honorable Jas. A. Wetmore, Acting Supervising Architect of the Treasury Department, an expression of the thanks and appreciation of the members for the new quarters which have been provided for the Legislature in the Federal and Territorial Building at Juneau, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That it also extend to the Honorable J. C. McBride, Custodian of said building, its thanks for the many courtesies extended to it during the present session of the Legislature, and for the manner in which the legislative halls, committee rooms and offices have been kept, and for all the conveniences which have been provided for it through his efforts.
