

Senate Joint Resolutions

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska that the Governor of Alaska be, and he hereby is, authorized to employ, for such number of hours per day and for such compensation as shall to him seem necessary and reasonable, a janitor to clean, care for and keep in proper order the rooms occupied by the Legislature in the Capitol during the current session of the Legislature; and that the expense necessarily incurred therefor, not in any event to exceed \$300.00, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska upon vouchers signed by the Governor, or otherwise as may be provided by law.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

A RESOLUTION

Authorizing the operation of the Tolovana Tram Road to be discontinued, and providing for its sale.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the Board of Road Commissioners, commonly known as the Alaska Road Commission, be and it is hereby authorized to discontinue the operation of the Tolovana Tram Road, extending from the town of Livengood to the Terminal Cabin on the Tolovana River a distance of about twelve miles, if in the opinion of said Board the money spent in maintaining and operating said Tram Road will better serve the interests of the inhabitants of town of Livengood and vicinity by being used toward the construction of a public road to connect said town of Livengood with the Fairbanks system of public roads.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners be and it is hereby authorized to sell, if it deem advisable, the said Tolovana Tram Road, buildings, tools and equipment, as a unit or severally, at public or private

sale for the highest price or prices obtainable. All money received by it from such sale or sales, shall be deposited in the treasury of the Territory of Alaska, and the Governor and the Secretary of the Territory are hereby authorized to execute in the name and under the Great Seal of said Territory such conveyance or conveyances as may be necessary or proper in the premises.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, the Treasurer is directed, by House Joint Resolution No. 2, Session Laws of Alaska of 1927, to set aside \$40,000.00 each year for the purpose of creating a fund with which to pay the expense of erecting new buildings for a Pioneers' Home, and:

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Territorial Legislature to extend all possible aid to the schools of the Territory, so that its children shall enjoy the best possible school facilities, and:

WHEREAS, there exists in the Town of Wrangell an emergency, owing to financial conditions in the United States, believed to be temporary, so that the sale of the school bonds voted by its people may be delayed, causing continued loss to the Town of Wrangell, and inefficiency in its school, because of lack of proper building and equipment,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, that the provision in House Joint Resolution No. 2, Session Laws of Alaska, 1927, requiring investment in Government bonds, be inoperative for the year 1931, and the Treasurer be authorized and directed to immediately purchase Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) worth of the Wrangell School Bonds for the 1931 investment of the Pioneers' Home Building Fund.

This change shall not be operative except for the year 1931; thereafter the Treasurer shall invest the money as heretofore directed.
