

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 7.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the Committees of the House and of the Senate on Judiciary and Federal Relations, at and during the present session, be and they hereby are authorized to expend the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) each, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for necessary supplies and for the employment of additional clerical help.

The Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the above mentioned sums upon warrants issued by the Auditor in accordance with law, said warrants to be issued upon vouchers approved by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House acting for the several Committees on Judiciary and Federal Relations of their respective Houses.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 8.

WHEREAS, The construction of the projected Yukon Highway is at the present time one of the greatest economic needs of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, The Lieutenant Governor and Premier and the other members of the Government of the Province of British Columbia, Dominion of Canada, have exerted every practicable effort to have said highway constructed at the earliest possible date; and

WHEREAS, The building of said highway will be of tremendous mutual advantage to both the territory of Alaska and to the Province of British Columbia arising not only from improved facilities of trade but from the increase in development of the general feeling of good will which has long animated both the residents of the United States and the Territory of Alaska and the residents of the Dominion of Canada; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the legislature of Alaska deeply appreciates the splendid and continued effort which has been and now is being made by the Lieutenant Governor, the Premier and the other members of the Government of the Province of British Columbia, for the early construction of said highway; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislature of Alaska extend its thanks to the Lieutenant Governor and the Premier and other members of the Government of British Columbia, for the work which they have done and are now doing to insure the early consummation of this project; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be forwarded to* the Lieutenant Governor and to the Premier of British Columbia.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 11.

A. Wetmore, Acting Supervising Architect, Treasury Department, and,

WHEREAS, the members of the Tenth Alaska Legislature have had their work, during the present session, greatly facilitated through the use of the new quarters and conveniences which have been provided in the said Federal and Territorial Building, and,

WHEREAS, J. C. McBride, Collector of Customs for Alaska, who is the custodian of the said building, has extended every courtesy to the members of the Legislature and has seen that the Legislative chambers, committee rooms and offices have been well taken care of during the entire session,
