(11) Do and perform every other thing necessary to secure the efficient and economic administration of the rural public schools, including the establishment of special schools and correspondence schools.

Section 2. All moneys now or hereafter covered into the general school fund shall be expended under the supervision of the Commissioner of Education and paid out upon vouchers approved by the Auditor. General school fund, how expended.

Section 3. All acts and parts of acts in conflict with any provisions of this act, are hereby repealed. Repeal.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act to be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval. Emergency.

CHAPTER 115.

AN ACT

[S. B. 128]

To authorize the Governor to petition the Federal Government for aid in the relief of destitution in this Territory; to empower him to accept and expend all grants made by the Federal Government for that purpose, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The Legislature of the Territory of Alaska does hereby declare that the present economic depression has created a serious emergency in this Territory, resulting in existing deprivation of a considerable number of families and individuals of the necessities of Emergency declared.

life, that the Territory and its municipalities have exhausted their available resources and thereby making it imperative for this Territory to seek aid and relief from the Federal Government.

Section 2. That the Governor is hereby authorized and requested to make application to the Federal Government, the Federal Emergency Relief Board, or any other agency or officer now or hereafter created or appointed by authority of the United States, for aid and assistance to this Territory and its inhabitants in meeting the cost of furnishing relief, and/or relief work, in the form of money, service, materials and/or commodities to provide the necessities of life to persons in need as a result of the present emergency and their dependents.

Section 3. The Governor is hereby authorized to receive such grants and to make adequate rules and regulations for the proper supervision of the expenditure and distribution of any money, service, materials and/or commodities received; such rules and regulations shall have the force and effect of law and violations thereof shall be punished as hereinafter provided. The Governor shall have authority to require any officer of this Territory or of any municipality or school district therein to render such reasonable services as may be necessary to make effective the purpose of this act, but no compensation shall be paid for any such service; and he is hereby given full power to do and perform every other act or thing necessary or required to be done to secure the aid and assistance of the Federal Government in the relief of persons made destitute by the present economic depression.

Penalty for
violations.

Section 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Act or any rules or regulations made pursuant thereto, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment in the federal jail not more than six months, or by

a fine not more than five hundred dollars, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist ^{Emergency.} and this act to be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 116.

AN ACT

[S. B. 58]

For the protection of passengers carried or transported for hire or reward in civil aircraft and to require persons engaged in commercial flying or in operating civil aircraft in Alaska to effect and maintain security for their ability to respond in damages arising out of personal injuries to or death of passengers carried or transported for hire or reward in such aircraft.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. No person engaged in commercial flying or in operating a civil aircraft in Alaska shall carry or transport any passenger for hire or reward in such aircraft without first effecting and thereafter, while so engaged, maintaining security, as hereinafter required, for such person's ability to respond in damages resulting from the flying or operation of such aircraft and arising by reason of personal injury to or death of any such passenger in the amount of at least \$5,000.00 for each such passenger who may sustain such personal injury or death.

Person operating aircraft must maintain security—for injuries to passengers—amount.

Section 2. Such security shall consist either of a policy or policies of insurance, with one or more good and reputable insurers, to be approved by the Auditor, who are authorized to engage in business in Alaska, insuring said person against damages as aforesaid, or,
