

of cause of death; length of residence at place of death, in hospital or institution, or in the Territory; former or usual residence; place and date of burial or removal; and the signature of the undertaker or person acting as such. Also, for the purpose of identification, the following additional information shall be entered on the back of the certificate of death as fully as the information can be obtained and the circumstances may render it necessary; height, weight, complexion, color of hair; if married, full name and residence of the surviving husband or wife; names and addresses of living children; names and addresses of other relatives; whether insured; and if so, in what company or companies, and for what amount or amounts; names and addresses of two or more persons who were acquainted with the decedent during his lifetime; and other facts that may be of assistance in identifying the deceased; Provided, that when it is impossible to secure any of the information required upon the blank, the item may be followed by the word "unknown".

CHAPTER 50.

AN ACT

[H. B. 29]

To repeal Chapter 11 of the Session Laws of 1917, the same being an act prohibiting the advertisement of certain beverages.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Chapter 11 of the Session Laws of Alaska for 1917, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 2. This Act shall become operative upon repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

CAPTER 51.

AN ACT

[H. B. 44]

To amend Section 1772, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913, relating to appeals from Probate Courts.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 1772, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913, be, and the same is, hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 1772. There shall be an appeal to the District Court of the Territory of Alaska from all orders, decrees and judgments of the Commissioner exercising the jurisdiction of a Court of Probate.”

Appeals to District Court from Probate Court.

CHAPTER 52.

AN ACT

[S. B. 3]

Creating a Territorial Board of Examiners in Optometry, providing for the registration of optometrists, defining and regulating the practice of optometry and providing penalties for the violation of the terms of said Act, and to repeal Chapter 30, Session Laws of Alaska, 1917.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

That Section 1 to 6, both inclusive, be stricken from Chapter 30, Session Laws of Alaska, 1917, and that
