2. That certified copies of this resolution be sent to the Vice President of the United States and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Alaska Delegate in Congress.

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

THAT, WHEREAS, the Lowell Creek Flume, erected by the War Department for the flood control of Lowell Creek at Seward, Alaska, is in urgent need of repair and maintenance, and

WHEREAS, the flood control of Lowell Creek is very necessary for the protection of Government property located at Seward, Alaska, and

WHEREAS, there are no Territorial funds available for that purpose,

We respectfully petition you to present the matter of repair and maintenance of the Lowell Creek Flume and the urgency thereof, to the Board of Army Engineers and to the Congress of the United States.

And your memorialists will ever pray.

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 4.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the people of this Territory, speaking by their duly elected Legislature in regular session assembled, do hereby express their high esteem for and the fullest confidence in Franklin D. Roose-

velt, the President of the United States, and in the policies adopted and pursued by him.
