

Sub-section Sixteenth a. To regulate the location of buildings or structures, designate the size, height and materials used therein and direct the use for such structures; and the Council may divide the town or municipality into zones or districts of such number and size as may by said council be deemed best suited for the needs; and the council may prohibit placing or keeping of offensive refuse, garbage or other unsightly or objectionable matter upon vacant lots or property within said municipality.

Power to regulate building and to provide for zoning districts.

Sub-section Sixteenth b. To condemn buildings and on thirty days legal notice to the owner or his agent cause their demolition where they have become a fire hazard or public nuisance or detrimental to the general beautification of the city. In the event of refusal to remove the objectionable building or buildings by the owner the cost incurred by the city in such removal shall be chargeable to the property.

Condemnation proceedings.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 11.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 22]

To amend Sections 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1935 and 1936, Compiled Laws of Alaska 1933, relating to the legislative department and providing for the publication of session laws of Alaska; this Act to have immediate effect upon its passage and approval.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Sections 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1935 and 1936, Compiled Laws of Alaska 1933, be and

the same are hereby amended by striking the word "Auditor" wherever it occurs in the said sections and substituting therefor the word "Secretary."

Section 2. This Act shall have immediate effect upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 12.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 6]

To repeal all of Article III, Chapter 1, of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, Sections 520 to 527 inclusive, requiring persons operating airplanes to give security for ability to respond in damages to persons injured.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That all of Article III, Chapter 1, of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER 13.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 17]

Providing for the keeping of records by second-hand dealers and pawnbrokers, providing punishment for violations thereof, and repealing Sections 4851 and 4852 Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Any person, firm or corporation, excepting banks, engaged in the business of buying and sell-
