

CHAPTER 23.

AN ACT

[H. B. 81]

Relating to the sale of property of decedents by executors and administrators, providing for the sale of real and personal property of decedents conjointly when deemed for the best interest of estates.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Whenever it be found upon petition duly presented that it be for the best interest of estates of decedents to sell the personal and real property thereof conjointly, the same may be sold the same as real estate under the provisions of Chapter CXLVIII (148) Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933.

Real and personal property of estate may be sold conjointly, —when.

CHAPTER 24.

AN ACT

[H. B. 61]

To appropriate Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for the use and aid of the Alaska Territorial Chamber of Commerce during the biennium commencing April 1, 1935, and authorizing the payment thereof by warrants drawn upon the Territorial Treasurer, and providing for the reporting by said Chamber of its activities and disbursements, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) is hereby appropriated out of monies in the Territorial Treasury for the use and aid of the Alaska Territorial Chamber of Commerce in conducting and

maintaining its activities during the biennium commencing April 1, 1935; provided, however, that not more than 50% of said monies shall be expended for wages or salaries of officers or employees of said Chamber during said period.

When and under what circumstances payment to be made.

Section 2. That before said Chamber of Commerce shall be paid any part of said money, reasonable proof shall be submitted on its behalf to the Governor of the Territory that Alaska local chambers of commerce, or similar civic organizations, whose combined local membership is not less than 500 dues paying members in such several local chambers, have joined or become organization members of said Alaska Territorial Chamber of Commerce. Upon such proof having been made to the Governor, the Auditor shall, upon the request of the Governor, draw a warrant upon the Treasurer of the Territory to pay to said Alaska Territorial Chamber of Commerce the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for its use and aid hereunder. Thereafter, from time to time, similar warrants for similar sums, but not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) at any one time or a total of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) shall be drawn; provided, however, that, prior to the issuance of a warrant for the second One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) appropriated hereunder, the said Alaska Territorial Chamber of Commerce shall file with the Governor an itemized, verified statement showing the disbursement and expenditure of the proceeds derived from the first warrant so drawn and a like itemized, verified statement covering the disbursement of the proceeds of each priorily issued warrant shall be filed with the Governor from time to time and prior to the issuance of a subsequent warrant. All such warrants shall be issued by the Auditor, upon the request of the Governor.

Territorial Treasurer authorized to make payments.

Section 3. The Territorial Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to said Alaska Terri-

torial Chamber of Commerce the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) upon warrants drawn hereunder.

Section 4. The Alaska Territorial Chamber of Commerce, prior to the convening of the 1937 session of the Alaska Territorial Legislature, shall make to the Governor a written, verified report of its activities and of its disbursements not only of all Territorial funds paid to it under this Act, but also of all funds otherwise received or collected by it.

Verified reports of activities and of disbursements to be filed.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 25.

AN ACT

[H. B. 5]

To amend Chapter 4, Article 2, Section 579, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to bounty on wolves and coyote and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 579, Article 2, Chapter 4, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Amendment.

Section 579. There is hereby placed upon every wild lobo or timber wolf and every wild coyote or prairie wolf, within the Territory, a bounty of twenty dollars, said sum to be paid in accordance with the provisions hereof.
