

establish all needful rules and regulations to carry into effect the provisions of this chapter, which rules and regulations shall be written or printed and preserved in the records of the office of the secretary-treasurer. And the members of said board shall each receive for each day actually engaged in the duties of their office as compensation the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars, together with all legitimate expenses incurred in attending the meeting of the board. All money collected by the board shall be paid into the Treasury of the Territory. The necessary expenses of the board shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Territory upon a warrant drawn by the Auditor of Alaska, which warrant shall be issued upon the order of the secretary-treasurer of said board. But such warrant shall be paid only from a fund specifically appropriated for the purpose, on the presentation of an itemized statement from said medical board of its receipts and expenditures.

CHAPTER 36.

AN ACT

[S. B. 8]

To amend Section 1501 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relative to Primary Elections and the Declaration of Candidacy therein.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

That Section 1501 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1501. PRIMARY ELECTIONS; HOW TO BECOME A CANDIDATE; DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY, FORM OF. All candidates for the office of

Candidates for public office nominated by direct primary election.

Delegate to Congress from Alaska, and all candidates for any other elective, Territorial or divisional office now or hereafter created by Act of Congress or the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, shall be nominated in a primary election by direct vote of the people in the following manner:

Any person who is a member of a political party and desires to become a candidate of that party for any elective office shall, on or before the first day of February before the date of the Primary Election, make, under oath, and file a declaration of candidacy, which shall contain the name, address and voting precinct of the candidate and a statement; that he is a qualified elector in such precinct; that he is a member of the political party from which he seeks the nomination; that, at each primary election at which he has voted during the preceding four years, he has voted a ballot of such party and will vote as a member of such party at the coming primary election and intends to vote for a majority of its nominees at the general election which follows; that, if nominated and elected he will support the principles of such party as set forth in its last national platform, and its platform for Alaska adopted during the preceding two years.

When declaration of candidacy to be filed and what to contain.

Such declaration shall be in substantially the following form:

DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY

I, _____, do hereby declare that I reside at _____, in the precinct of _____ in the _____ Judicial Division, Territory of Alaska, and am a qualified elector therein; I am a member of the _____ party. In each primary election at which I have voted during the preceding four years I have voted a _____ ballot, and will vote a ballot of _____

such party at the coming primary election and intend to vote for a majority of its nominees at general election which follows.

I hereby declare myself a candidate for nomination to the office of to be made at the primary election to be held on the day of in the year 19....., and hereby request that my name be printed upon the official primary ballot, as provided by law, as a candidate of the party.

I further declare that, if nominated and elected, I will qualify as and that I will support and abide by the principles enumerated by the party in its last national platform in this Territory adopted during the preceding two years.

I accompany herewith the sum of \$....., the fee required by law of me for becoming such candidate.

Proviso.

Nothing contained herein shall prevent one who has not voted at any primary election during the preceding four years from becoming a candidate in any primary election.
