

hereby appropriated out of the funds of the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the construction and repair of rural schools and fuel sheds for rural schools, and for the purchase and installation of equipment for rural schools in the Territory of Alaska.

Section 2. The Territorial Board of Education is hereby empowered to expend not to exceed the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) appropriated upon the erection and equipping of such rural schools in the Territory of Alaska as in its judgement are deemed necessary, to be paid out on vouchers approved by the President of the Territorial Board of Education. ^{is \$40,000 to be expended on rural schools.}

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately after its passage and approval. ^{Emergency.}

CHAPTER 64.

AN ACT

[H. B. 96]

To establish scholarships for certain high school graduates in the Territory to attend the University of Alaska.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the high school student in each graduating class in the several high schools of the Territory, who, upon the completion of four years of high school work in the high schools of the Territory, obtains the highest average standing for all the credits earned, and who is graduated at an annual commence- ^{Scholarships.}

ment is hereby entitled to receive during dormitory residence at the University of Alaska a scholarship covering dormitory rent for a period of two years next succeeding the year of graduation upon presenting to the Registrar of the University a certificate signed by the Superintendent or Principal of the high school from which such student is graduated stating that the graduate therein named is entitled to receive the benefits of the scholarship herein provided. Dormitory residence shall be governed by such rules and regulations as the Board of Regents shall establish concerning the same.

Alternate.

Section 2. In the event any graduate entitled to receive the benefits of the provisions of this Act declines or fails to accept the scholarship herein provided the graduate standing next in line in class standing shall be entitled to receive the benefits of the provisions of this Act.

Certificate.

Section 3. All certificates shall be applied for and issued to graduates on or before the first day of August of each year and shall be reported forthwith by the Superintendent or Principal issuing the same to the Registrar of the University.

Forfeiture.

Section 4. Failure to do passing work in more than one subject during any semester, withdrawal from the University, or expulsion shall constitute a forfeiture during the following semester or semesters of the benefits herein provided.

Payment by
Territory.

Section 5. Payment of the scholarships herein provided is to be made monthly to the University upon vouchers drawn upon the Territorial Treasurer and duly certified by the Treasurer and the President of the Board of Trustees of the University; provided, however, no payments shall be made in excess of sums or amounts specifically appropriated for this purpose.
