

Section 2. That the appropriation herein made shall become available only in the event that an appropriation to construct the said hospital at Kodiak, Alaska, shall be obtained from the Federal Government as a grant for that purpose and said hospital is built and in operation. Conditions.

Section 3. That the said hospital be operated and conducted by the Territorial Board of Health and that its management be in the hands of a local Board of Trustees, appointed by the Governor of Alaska, and residing at Kodiak, Alaska, and to be governed by rules and regulations prescribed by the said Territorial Board of Health. Operation of hospital.

Section 4. That before any sums shall be paid under the provisions of this Act, the Board of Trustees of the said hospital, shall submit an itemized statement of its receipts and expenditures for the preceding year, which statement shall be certified to by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees; provided, this appropriation shall not become effective or available until there shall be duly incorporated at Kodiak, a city of the second class or an independent school district. CHAPTER 67.

AN ACT

[H. B. 122]

Requiring City Councils and organizations or individuals who have been given the custody of children by the Board of Children's Guardians to provide fire escapes on school buildings and dormitories.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the city councils of all the cities and the school boards of any incorporated school dis-

Parties having custody of children from Board of Children's Guardians to provide fire escapes.

tricts other than in incorporated towns in Alaska and all organizations or individuals who have been given the custody of children by the Board of Children's Guardians shall provide at least one external stairway as a fire escape on all school buildings, and buildings or dormitories which contain only one stairway to the ground floor, two or more stories in height, housing three or more children under the custody of the Board of Children's Guardians.

Territorial Highway Engineer to have fire escapes constructed—
When.

Section 2. In the event that a city council or school board shall refuse to abide by the provisions of this Act, or shall fail to construct such fire escapes in accordance with the provisions of this Act on or before September 1, 1935, then the Territorial Highway Engineer shall have the same constructed, and shall present the costs of the same to the Commissioner of Education, who shall pay the same out of the funds appropriated for the support of incorporated school districts, and shall deduct such an amount from the refunds to said city school board. In the event that organizations or individuals who have been given the custody of children by the Board of Children's Guardians do not comply with these provisions on or before September 1, 1935 then the Board of Children's Guardians shall install such fire escapes and reduce the compensation one dollar per month per child until the cost of said stairway has been paid.
