ness in Alaska, as surety thereon, conditioned that it will safely keep and pay on demand to the Treasurer as required by him, all funds of the Territory deposited with it. The banks in which Territorial funds are deposited shall pay interest on the average daily balance due the Territory at a rate to be fixed by the Banking Board, at a regular or special meeting of that Banking Board, and such interest when paid shall be covered into the treasury. Provided further, that nothing in this section shall prohibit the Treasurer from depositing such funds as may be necessary for the proper conduct of his office in solvent banks outside the Territory of Alaska.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 7.

AN ACT

[S. B. 16]

Prohibiting the retention of lost property by finder without advertising or notifying officers, prescribing punishment therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Lost property—
Finder to
notify, etc.

Section 1. Any person who finds lost property and appropriates such property to his own use or to the use of another person not entitled thereto, without immediately or within a reasonable time thereafter, adver-

tising such fact in a paper of general circulation published nearest the place where found, and stating therein a full and true description of such property, with marks of identification, if any; or, without notifying the United States Marshal or any of his deputies nearest to the place where found and giving a full and true description of said property, together with the time, place and circumstances under which found, shall be guilty of larceny and punished as provided in Section 4800, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933. ^{Penalty.} Provided that the finder of such property may retain the same until reimbursed for the cost of advertising and preserving or protecting said property.

CHAPTER 8.

AN ACT

[H. B. 12]

Providing for the licensing of all Persons Engaged in Digging Clams for Commercial Use, providing penalties for those violating the Act, and providing for the payment of license fee by those buying the clams, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent herewith.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Definitions. In this Act, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:

“Clam-digger” means any person who digs or otherwise gathers clams, oysters, mollusks, mussels, or other bivalvular animals for sale to any cannery, food market or any commercial enterprise, and is paid either by the amount of such animals he or she gathers, or is paid by wages. ^{“Clam-diggers” defined.}
