

(c). By reporting to the Governor the location of such roads, trails and bridges as in his opinion are reasonably necessary to render possible and expedient the development of any mineral resources.

(d). Generally, by giving such advice, information, and directions as may be of assistance to the miners and prospectors of the Territory.

CHAPTER 81.

AN ACT

[H. B. 94]

To amend Article V, Chapter IX, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relative to the authority of the Liquor Control Board, repealing Sections 3171 to 3180 inclusive, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, providing for enforcement of the rules and regulations of said Liquor Board and making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Article V, Chapter IX, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto Sections 844, 845. Enforcement officer for Board of Liquor Control.

"Sec. 844. The Board, upon organization, shall elect one of its members Enforcement Officer whose duties License officers. it shall be to enforce the laws, rules and regulations respecting the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquor, the board may appoint from persons nominated by the Treasurer, at a salary of not more than Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per month, not more than four License Officers, who shall have all the powers now exercised by United States Marshals in the enforcement of the laws of the Territory. They

may also be designated Deputy Collectors of Licenses and taxes under such rules and regulations as the Treasurer may prescribe and shall give bond to the Territory in such sum as the Treasurer may require for the faithful performance of their duties and accounting for all moneys that may come into their hands."

Local option elections.

"Sec. 845. The Board of Liquor Control is hereby authorized and directed to provide a system for the holding of local option elections in the Territory of Alaska and to prescribe the rules and regulations for the holding of elections and the canvassing of the votes thereof. Whenever the term intoxicating liquor is used in this Act it shall be deemed to include all spirituous, vinous malt or other fermented or distilled liquor intended for human consumption and containing more than one per cent alcohol by volume."

Definition.

Appropriation to carry out act.

Section 2. In order to carry out the provisions of Sec. 844 of this Act and for the enforcement of all rules and regulations promulgated by the Board as well as the laws of the United States and the Territory of Alaska pertaining to the manufacture, sale, barter, or furnishing of intoxicating liquors, the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) or so much thereof as is necessary is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the Territory of Alaska.

Repeal.

Section 3. Article VII, Chapter LXI, Section 3171 to 3180 inclusive, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933 are hereby repealed.

Emergency.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in force and effect immediately after its passage and approval.
