SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 6.

TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES; AND THE HONORABLE ANTHONY J. DIMOND, DELEGATE TO CONGRESS FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in regular session assembled, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, it is a fundamental purpose of the Government to spread employment so that the greatest number of our people may find it possible to earn a fair living, and,

WHEREAS, in all relief measures so far adopted by the Federal Government there has been a basic rule that so long as one member of a family is gainfully employed no others should be eligible for relief, and,

WHEREAS, a large number of Federal employees and appointees in Alaska have husbands and wives who are gainfully employed either in private occupations or by the Federal Government itself, and,

WHEREAS, a number of capable and deserving people who need the employment are prevented from obtaining it because of the facts stated in the above clauses, and,

WHEREAS, such double employment in some families and an absolute absence of a chance for employment in other equally deserving families effects unnecessary hardships and brings about a general dissatisfaction, and,

WHEREAS, it is within the power of the Federal Government to remedy such an unfair and inequitable distribution of employment, and,

WHEREAS, such a system brings luxury to one and deprivation of necessities to another,

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, most respectfully prays that the Federal Government, in selecting its employees, do not hire, engage or employ any person whose spouse is gainfully employed or engaged and in such employment or occupation earns the sum of \$175.00 or more per month.

SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 8.

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR and THE HONORABLE
A. J. DIMOND, DELEGATE TO CONGRESS FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in regular session assembled, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, the Federal government, through the Department of the Interior, erected and maintained at the Chicago World's Fair, an Alaska building and exhibit, and

WHEREAS, as the result of such Alaska exhibit much valuable publicity was given to the natural and scenic resources of the Territory of Alaska, and

WHEREAS, there is to be held in the city of San Diego, California, during the year 1935, a World's Fair similar to that held in Chicago in 1933, and

WHEREAS, we are informed the Federal government has appropriated the sum of \$350,000 for its participation in said San Diego Fair,

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of Alaska, respectfully requests and urges the Department of the Interior to erect and maintain during the life of the said World's Fair at San
