SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 9.

TO THE HONORABLE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of Alaska, respectfully presents, that under the Organic Act of this Territory its Legislature is denied authority to alter, amend, modify or repeal the laws in force at the time of the approval of said Act, (August 24, 1912), providing for taxes on business, occupation and trades and that on account of such inhibition the Territorial Legislature is unable to correct manifest injustice suffered by many who, under said laws, are required to pay license taxes disproportionate to the amount of volume of business transacted by them:

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialist, respectfully prays that the Organic Act of Alaska be amended by repealing that portion thereof in Section 24, Title 48 USC which denies authority to the Territorial Legislature to alter, amend, modify or repeal the law heretofore and now in force fixing the amount of license taxes on business, trades and occupations.
