

Senate Joint Resolutions

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS as a result of the generous bequest of William P. Rauch to the Alaska Historical Library and Museum of the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, the "William P. Rauch Collection" was added to the said Alaska Historical Library and Museum, and under the instructions of House Joint Resolution No. 1 of the Alaska Territorial Legislature of 1931 the said collection was limited to Indian basketry; and

WHEREAS it is the opinion of Territorial Historical Library and Museum Commission that it would be to advantage to the said Museum and to the said collection to add other items of historical interest to the said collection;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved that the said Territorial Historical Library and Museum Commission is hereby empowered to purchase with said funds any article or articles that they may deem to be of historical value, and add the same to the "William P. Rauch Collection."

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

WHEREAS, Clara E. LaMotte and Jessie Gilpatrick are residents of Alaska and have been under the care of a physician for several years in Seattle, Washington and Los Angeles, California.

WHEREAS, the said Clara E. LaMotte and Jessie Gilpatrick are indigents and are not eligible for a pension under the laws of the Territory of Alaska due to the fact that they have not reached sixty years of age; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska that the Territorial Treasurer is hereby authorized, and directed to pay to the said Clara E. LaMotte and Jessie Gilpatrick the sum of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) each per months, for their care and support, during the remainder of their lives, upon warrants issued by the Auditor according to the laws of the Territory of Alaska.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 4.

WHEREAS, Marie Niebling is a resident of Alaska and has been such a resident for the past thirty-five years, and is now living at Arlington, Washington, and has with her in her care and control an imbecile daughter of the age of thirty-eight years, and is without means or employment, and no possible means of earning a living for her support and the support of said daughter; and,

WHEREAS, the said Marie Niebling is not eligible for pension under the laws of the Territory of Alaska; and,

WHEREAS, Ruth Miller Staats is a resident of Alaska and has been such resident since childhood, and is now living at Valdez, Alaska, and has been an invalid since 1929, at which time, as a result of an airplane accident, she became paralyzed from the waist down; and,

WHEREAS, her widowed mother has no regular income and must provide for and care for said daughter; and,

WHEREAS, the said Ruth Miller Staats is not eligible for a pension at her present age;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska that the Territorial Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the said Marie Niebling and the said Ruth Miller Staats the sum of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) per month each,
