

# LAWS OF ALASKA

---

## CHAPTER 1.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 1]

To appropriate funds for payment of deficiencies in various appropriations heretofore made, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. The following sums of money are hereby appropriated from the Treasury of the Territory, or as much thereof as shall in each case be necessary, for the purposes stated below, which appropriations are to be supplementary to the appropriations heretofore made for the same purposes:

(a) Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for the payment of bounties on eagles for the biennium ending March 31, 1937.

(b) Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for the payment of bounties on hair seals for the biennium ending March 31, 1937.

(c) Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00) for the payment of bounties on wolves and coyotes for the biennium ending March 31, 1937.

(d) One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for contingent expenses of the office of the Territorial Treasurer for the payment for the auditing of Territorial books for the biennium ending March 31, 1937. <sup>For Treasurer.</sup>

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval. <sup>Emergency.</sup>

## CHAPTER 2.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 2]

To amend Sub-Section 9 of Section 3138, Compiled Laws of Alaska for 1933, providing for a tax on Fish Buyers dealing in fresh fish.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Sub-Section 9 of Section 3138 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska providing for a tax on Fish Buyers dealing in fresh fish, be and the same is hereby repealed. <sup>Fish buyers tax repealed.</sup>
