

CHAPTER 27.

AN ACT

[H. B. 28]

To amend Section 802, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to The Board of Administration, and repealing Sec. 803 of said Compiled Laws.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 802, Compiled Laws of Al- Amended.
aska, 1933, be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 802. Powers. All appropriations now or here-
after made payable out of the general fund or public
school current fund of the Territorial Treasury, except
those made for the following purposes, for maintenance
and operation of public schools, public asylums or public
homes, allowances to aged persons, for the relief and
rescue of lost persons, for support or relief of indigents
or of dependent children, for payment of salaries of
territorial officials and employees, for payment of
necessary administrative expenses of territorial offices,
or for payment of bounties, are hereby declared to be
maximum, conditional and proportionate appropriations
and, to the extent of the respective amounts for which
such respective appropriations are made, shall be pay-
able in full if necessary and then only in the event the
aggregate revenues to be collected and available during
each fiscal year of the biennium for which such appro-
priations may be made are estimated by the Board of
Administration to be sufficient to pay all appropriations
in full, otherwise, all appropriations out of the general
fund, other than those herein above excepted, shall be
known as special appropriations, and shall be subject
to the provisions of this Act. The Board of Adminis-
tration is hereby given full power and authority to

examine and survey the progress of the collection of revenues out of which all appropriations may be payable, and, from time to time, to declare and determine which of such special appropriations shall be utilized for the purposes mentioned in such appropriation, out of available funds not needed for the payment of appropriations specifically excepted herefrom. In making such examination and survey, said Board may require estimates of the prospective collection of revenues from the Treasurer, Auditor, tax and license collectors, and any other revenue assessing or collecting agency of the territory having information which, in the opinion of the Board of Administration, may be pertinent. The purpose and policy of this Act are to provide and insure that, at the end of the fiscal period, no overdraft or deficit, growing out of appropriations, shall exist in the general fund of the Territorial Treasury, and the Board of Administration is directed so to administer this Act as to prevent any such overdraft or deficit.

CHAPTER 28.

AN ACT

[H. B. 33]

To provide for a seal for the office of the Auditor of Alaska, a seal for the office of Registrar of Vital Statistics, and to provide for the certification and authentication of the records of the said offices by the Chief Clerk thereof, whenever same is necessary.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Sec. 1. The Auditor of Alaska shall have a seal of office, which shall be two and one-half inches in
