

CHAPTER 38.

AN ACT

[H. B. 93]

For the return of money paid by Donald F. Foster on application for Admission to the Bar, not complied with.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation
for reimburse-
ment of Donald
Foster for mon-
ies expended.

Section 1. That the sum of Twenty-five Dollars is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Territorial Treasury for the benefit of Donald F. Foster, as a refund paid by the said Donald F. Foster and transmitted to the Territorial Treasurer of the Territory on an application for Admission to the Bar during the year of 1935, but unable to further prosecute his said application, therefore, abandoning the same, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay said sum to the said Donald F. Foster.

CHAPTER 39.

AN ACT

[H. B. 101]

To amend Chapter 88 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1935, relating to Alaska Planning Council, making an appropriation, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Amended.

That Chapter 88, Session Laws of Alaska, 1935, be, and the same is, hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby created an agency to be known as the Alaska Planning Council, consisting of nine members to be appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall be an ex-officio member of the Council. The members shall be selected without regard to political affiliation. The terms of the members shall be two years. Members shall be removed only for cause. Vacancies shall be filled by the Governor. The members shall select one of their members as chairman.

Alaska Planning Council created.

Section 2. In order that Alaska shall realize the greatest possible benefit from the natural, agricultural, industrial and other resources of the Territory, including (a) communication and transportation facilities, (b) fisheries, (c) forests, (d) industrial and commercial establishments, (e) lands, (f) mines and minerals, (g) rivers and harbors, (h) wild life and recreational facilities, (i) water sheds furnishing water for irrigation and domestic use, the Council shall have power and it shall be its duty:

Purpose of Planning Council.

(1) To make inquiries, investigations and surveys concerning the resources of all sections of the Territory.

Powers and duties.

(2) To assemble and analyze the data thus obtained and to formulate plans for the conservation of such resources and the planned and systematic utilization and development thereof.

(3) To make recommendations, from time to time, as to the best methods of such conservation, utilization and development.

(4) To cooperate with the United States, other States or Territories and their agencies, and the departments of Alaska and all other public agencies of this Territory in such planning, conservation, utilization and development of resources.

Council to Cooperate.

(5) The Council shall report their findings to the Territorial Legislature.

Master plan for development of Territory to be prepared.

Section 3. The Council shall prepare and perfect from time to time a Territorial master plan for the economical and orderly development of the natural, agricultural and industrial resources of the Territory including plans for the conservation of public works needed in connection with the conservation and development of such resources. Such master plan shall be adopted and amended only by a majority vote of the Council and shall be a guide to the Council in making recommendations to the Governor and other officers, boards, commissions and departments of the Territory.

Public hearings may be held.

Section 4. The Council, or any member thereof, when authorized to do so by a majority of the Council, may hold public hearings and may invite the attendance of witnesses and the production of evidence.

Salary and expenses of members.

Section 5. Each member of the Alaska Planning Council shall receive his actual traveling expenses and subsistence while attending a meeting of the Council, and in addition thereto the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per day for each day such member is actually and necessarily absent from his place of business as a result of such Council meetings; provided, however, no such per diem shall be allowed any member of such Council who is regularly employed by the Government of the United States or the Government of the Territory of Alaska. The Council shall also have the power to appoint the necessary field assistants and clerical help to carry into effect the purposes of the Act.

Proviso.

Assistants may be employed.

Appropriation to carry act into effect.

Section 6. The sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the Treasury of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, to carry into effect the provisions of this Act.

Section 7. An emergency is hereby declared to exist Emergency. and this Act shall be in effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 40.

AN ACT

[H. B. 103]

For appropriating funds for reimbursing the Empire Printing Company for extra House and Senate Journals during the Twelfth Session of the Legislature, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the sum of One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars and Fifty-two Cents, (\$125.52), is hereby appropriated from the Treasury of the Territory for the purpose of paying the Empire Printing Company for printing and delivering fifty extra copies House Journals during the Twelfth Session of the Legislature. Appropriation for printing and delivering extra copies of House and Senate journals.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist Emergency. and this Act shall be in effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
