

CHAPTER 4.

AN ACT

[H. B. 7]

To provide a standing reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person or persons breaking into and entering any cache, cabin, building or warehouse, located outside the limits of any incorporated town in the Territory of Alaska; appropriating the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, or as much thereof, as may be needed to pay such rewards, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That there is hereby provided a standing reward of One Hundred Dollars to be paid to any person, not a Marshal, Deputy Marshal or other Peace Officer who lodges information that leads to the arrest and conviction of any person, or persons, maliciously breaking into and entering any cache, cabin, house or warehouse, whether occupied or unoccupied, located outside the boundaries of any incorporated town in the Territory of Alaska.

Reward for arrest of persons breaking or entering cabins, etc.

Section 2. That the Territorial Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay all claims for rewards upon certificate by a U. S. Commissioner or Clerk of the District Court, showing that the claimant has duly lodged information that resulted in an arrest and conviction under the provisions of Section 1 of this Act.

Treasurer authorized to pay reward.

Section 3. That there is hereby appropriated the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, or so much thereof as shall be necessary to pay rewards to persons entitled thereto.

Appropriation.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
