

CHAPTER 46.

AN ACT

[S. B. 43]

To provide for the payment of salaries to certain Members of the Territorial Legislature, Thirteenth Session, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation for payment of salaries of members of Territorial Legislature.

Section 1. That the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) is hereby appropriated for the payment of salaries, in the amounts herein specified, to the following Members of the Thirteenth Session of the Territorial Legislature: Senator J. F. Devine, \$105.00; Senator John B. Powers, \$180.00; Representative John Lichtenberg, \$105.00; Representative Andrew Nerland, \$105.00; Representative Tolbert Scott, \$105.00.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 47.

AN ACT

[S. B. 12]

To establish an Agricultural Experiment Fur Farm Station as Sub-station Number Two of the Department of Agriculture Experiment Station of the University of Alaska and to appropriate the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for the same.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Fur Farm experiment station established.

Section 1. In accordance with the provisions of the laws of the United States establishing agricultural

experiment stations in land grant colleges in the states and territories of the United States, there is hereby created and established in the Territory of Alaska under the Department of Agriculture Experiment Station of the University of Alaska a Fur Farm Experiment Station to be designated as Substation Number Two.

Section 2. There are hereby appointed as a committee to select a site for said Substation Number Two the Governor of the Territory, the Regional Forester in Alaska, and the Chief Representative of the Bureau of Biological Survey resident in Alaska, who shall on or before the first day of July, 1937, report in writing to the Board of Regents of the University of Alaska the location of the site selected.

Committee appointed to select site of station.

Section 3. The Board of Regents of the University of Alaska, upon receipt of the report above mentioned, shall forthwith proceed to acquire the designated site, build, establish and maintain thereon an agricultural experiment fur farm station of which the leading object and duty shall be to conduct original researches or verify experiments on the physiology of furbearing animals, the diseases to which they are severally subject, with remedies for the same, the composition and digestibility of the different kinds of food required for furbearing animals, and such other researches or experiments as bear directly upon the fur farming industry.

Board of Regents of University of Alaska to acquire site, build, establish and maintain.

Section 4. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) to carry into effect the provisions of this Act.

Appropriation.

Section 5. That all proceeds from such fur farm be covered into the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska.

Proceeds paid to Treasury of Territory of Alaska.

Section 6. The funds herein provided and the duties hereby imposed shall be expended and discharged by the Board of Regents of the University of Alaska in

conformity with the provisions of Chapter 49, Session Laws of Alaska, 1935, approved March 12, 1935, the same being the Act creating and establishing the University of Alaska.

CHAPTER 48.

AN ACT

[S. B. 321]

To safeguard the books, records and files in the offices of the United States Commissioners and Recorders in the Territory of Alaska, and making an appropriation therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Providing for safeguard of books and records of United States Commissioners and recorders outside incorporated towns.

Section 1. For the purpose of protecting and safeguarding the mining, probate and other records, books and files, from loss or damage by fire, flood or theft, the Clerk of the District Court of the respective Judicial Divisions of the Territory, are hereby authorized, and it is made their duty, to provide suitable fireproof safes or vaults for each United States Commissioner's and Recorder's Office outside of an incorporated town, and which is not now adequately protected, and as far as may be done within the limit of the monies by this Act appropriated and apportioned.

Appropriation.

Section 2. The sum of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) is hereby appropriated to carry out the provisions of this Act and all expenditures shall be by warrant drawn upon the Territorial Treasurer in payment of vouchers approved by the Clerk of the District Court.
